




NOW...


For freshmen, Sept. 4, 1991 was a day of new clothes, new hallways, new teachers, new friends and (uh oh) upperclassmen!





FINE ARTS


















PHYS. ED.



Special Services





Ethel Kaskiw Kindzierski Editor-in-Chief 1942

In 1942, Miss Anne Drew Scott, the school's principal; Miss Powers, an English teacher; Mr. Bareford, a business teacher; and Ethel Kaskiw, a class of '42 senior, made a decision that would affect countless students. They decided that CHS would have a school yearbook. Many schools in the area had already published their own yearbooks, so why couldn't Carteret High have a yearbook. Besides, the yearbook as it existed, was a memorabilia, especially for seniors.

However, since this was their first year, the newly created Loudspeaker staff had a great deal to learn. They didn't know where to begin. They did, on the other hand, have a dedicated staff led by Ethel Kaskiw, editor-in-chief, encouraging advisors, and a supportive student body. It took hard work, cooperation, and a lot of typing, but they finally finished the yearbook and now - 50 years later - the Loudspeaker is in its 50th edition. Taking a look back, Mrs. Ethel Kaskiw Kindzierski, says it quite simply, "It was a pleasure doing."







snap of the ball was second year quarterback, Keith Kapinos, who led the team with rushing touchdowns totalling 6 in the year.

















Who has been the most influential person in your career? The most influential person I'd say is my father. He's given me confi-dence and support when I need it and has helped me with my mental part of the game as well.







YEAR IN REVIEW


