



others have. This would leave a legacy for the Class of 1998 as the class who really cared about Carteret.









Superintendent, Mr. S. Louis Panigrosso, will retire after 34 years of service in the Carteret school system.

Mr. Panigrosso started teaching social studies in 1964 at Carteret High School. In 1970 he became Chairman of the Social Studies Department and part time director of Adult Education. Mr. Panigrosso stayed at this position until becoming Principal of Lincoln School in 1976, and then Assistant Superintendent in 1991. In 1994 he was appointed to his current position, Superintendent of Schools.

Senior Mike Comba has fond memories of Mr. Panigrosso as Principal of Lincoln School. "He was a good Principal. He always remembered your name and would talk to you and ask how you were doing. He always kept the school in line and left a fear in the students. There aren't too many Principals like that anymore."

While Mr. Panigrosso was heavily involved in teaching. he also found time to be an advisor from 1968-1970. Larry Lewis, who still lives in Carteret and was the last Student Council President to serve under Mr. Panigrosso, commented, "Mr. Panigrosso was a very nice man. More than an educator, he was a leader. He was very inspirational. Like many people in the Carteret System, he's inspired me to be what I am today.'

"He has always been kind and caring to everyone as well as possessing a great sense of humor," reminisces Ms. Holowatch, Mr. Panigrosso's secretary. She has known him since 1972 when, "...he was a social studies teacher and I

was a Senior atCHS. Although I didn't have him as a teacher, at that time. upperclassmen. on occasion. would run errands for teachers. My daily errand was to get coffee for members of social studies department prior coming school."

She explained with a

Panigrosso smile, "Mr. Panigrosso has always been dedicated to the staff and students of our school system. It was a pleasure to work for him and wish him health and happiness in his retirement."

Mr. Panigrosso loved all the positions he has held but

feels that, "...teaching, that's where it's at..." When asked about his various positions, he replies, "When your career takes a different path, you accept the challenges of the position and do the best job possible."

Vice Principal of Minue School and close personal friend, Mr. Salvatoriello explains that Mr. Panagrosso

> is very much the family man, as well as a professional.

"He enjoys spending time with his family grandchildren. His life is pretty much centered around them. He also spends a great deal of time doing community things. He was a of Grand Knight of the Knights of Columbus and also an active member of his

Mr. Sal has known Mr. Panigrosso for 33 years. starting when Mr. Panigrosso was a student teacher and. "right off the bat we became friends. He is very down to earth and has a good sense of humor. We always had alot of

contact on the job and maintained family friendships off the job, weddings, family functions... even today we speak on the phone. At the end of the day we call each other and commiserate. He liked to play tennis and beat me all the time... and he loves Chinese food; whenever we go out to lunch we are always winding up at a Chinese restaurant.'

"He is a very approachable person... many students felt he was approachable, very comfortable and had an informal personality, yet they learned alot and he was very knowledgeable," commented Salvatoriello.

Mr. Panigrosso has, "mixed emotions about leaving, but I leave with a sense of gratitude to have been able to serve in so many capacities. Every decision I've made was with the best interest of the students and staff. If anyone remembers me, remember me as a person who put students and staff first; especially the students who are the real jewels of the Carteret community and of its future."

No immediate plans are in Panigrosso's future, but he feels that he, "will still stay involved in education but certainly not on a full time basis." For right now he just wants to "pursue some interests and enjoy life a little."



Governor Christine Todd Whitman visited Carteret on September 10, 1997, to tour LM Foods' plant. LM Foods is a food manufacturing company brought to Carteret through the Urban Enterprise Zone. The intent of an Urban Enterprise Zone is to entice companies to come to the town because the sales tax is reduced. A company only has to change 3% sales tax and the other 3% goes back to the town.

with Mayor Peter J. Sica, the head of LM Foods, Mr. Park, and members of the Republican party, she saw what the company produces and how they



Rambler Football








Rambler Cross Country








