

























Ten-year-old Brendan Ringwood was diagnosed with the disease this past summer. According to The American Medical Association Family Medical Guide, Crohn's disease is a chronic, or long term inflammation of part of the digestive tract. The cause of the disease is not known, but it does not seem to be either hereditary or infectious. Symptoms include abdominal pain, attacks of cramps, severe bleeding, and if not treated, it can increase susceptibility to cancer of the intestine. Treatment for the diesase include analgesics, vitamin supplements, an established diet and, other treatments depending on the severity of the disease.

"It's something he's going to have all his life so we have been educationg ourselves with informa tion hoping he won't get as sick as he has been," commented Marylu Ringwood, Brendan's mom.


Brendan has a severe case of Crohn's and has had to have eight blood transfusions. He is also under an immune suppressor, which has prevented his return to his fifth grade class. If the doctors give the "OK" he'll return to school after the holidays. "I'm happy to be back home. It's not fun being in the hospital. I really wish to be back in school because I'm bored at home," said Brendan.

Mrs. Ringwood also stated, "We really appreciated the support. It was a surprise for us that the Junior Class decided to donate the money to Brendan."


