A

military

- **doves** = cut defense budget by 50%
- **end nuclear stockpiling** = end testing & make more peace treaties
- **establish a U.S. Department of Peace** with a goal to end all war thru effective negotiations & intermediaries

A

military

- **diplomacy focus** = moderate on foreign involvement in conflict
- **cut resources of hostile nations** = ally with U.N., ensure severest economic sanctions on abusive dictators, genocide, or terrorists

A

military

- **hawks** = strong military & world leader in technology of transport, surveillance, & weaponry
- **target terrorists** = pre-emptive strikes acceptable toward terrorists; sanction nations that support them

A

military

- **isolationist** = U.S. should not intervene in international conflict that does not target U.S.
- **minimal military spending** = minimize taxes; maintain only enough military power to defend U.S. borders
