- **charter school support** = support choice of publically funded schools

education

- **public school support** = increase funding to reduce class size & provide for special needs; charter schools ok, not vouchers

education

- **private school support thru vouchers** = tax payers should get reimbursement to cover private school tuition

- **homeschool or unschooling** = no compulsory education
- **free-market schooling** = private untaxed schools only, with local governance and no subsidies or mandates; taxpayers should not be forced to fund indoctrination of their own or others' children
