about birth control

birth control

- **pro-choice** = community clinics locally should continue to fund adoptions and contraception, free to women at poverty level
- **focus on prevention** = easily accessible contraception

A

birth control

- **pro-choice** = government should continue to fund adoption agencies & planned parenthood (with contraception and abortion free to women at poverty level)
- **focus on prevention** = easily accessible contraception

A

birth control

- **pro-life** = abortion should be illegal except in cases of danger to mother's life
- **anti-subsidy** = planned parenthood should not be government funded
- **focus on prevention** = teach abstinence in schools instead of sex education & contraception

birth control

- **pro-choice** = abortion should not be illegal
- **anti-subsidy** = government should not continue to fund planned parenthood
