BIOGRAPHY

Zach's Story

Zach Haines is a singer/songwriter born and raised in Gladwin, Michigan, a small farm town in the central part of the state. He grew up playing many sports, but always had a passion for wrestling. He started at the age of 5 and wrestled until his senior year when he was forced to give it up because of a complete ACL tear he sustained during the football season, which resulted in having reconstructive surgery. Zach was also member of the local 4-H program and raised pigs to show during fair week. Zach began playing guitar at the age of 10 when he received an acoustic, Washburn, six string guitar for his birthday from his grand maw. Zach began learning the chords he was shown by his uncle and was soon able to play some intros to simpler songs. Never having interest in formal guitar lessons, Zach learned most of what he knows from watching older family members play at get-together's. Every family function was an opportunity to learn, since most of his mother's relatives were musically inclined. He believes that's where his style of "back porch picker" came from. An attitude of "it may not be technically right, but hell, it sounds good, so run with it and do your thing." His parents were very patient and supportive of him while he learned and endured countless hours of the same songs over and over. He would play until his fingers bled just trying to get the songs to sound how he wanted. He later wrote a song about that time in his life titled, "The Sound".

Zach graduated in 2004 and worked various dead end jobs before realizing he needed more structure in his life and decided to join the U.S. Army as a Calvary Scout. He completed 3.5 years of service before being medically discharged. Zach was awarded the Purple Heart for injuries he sustained while deployed to Iraq in 2006. He was medically retired in 2008 as a result of his injuries and currently resides in Jefferson, Georgia with his wife and son. After being medically retired from the Army, Zach, his wife and son relocated to North Georgia. Zach took up the role as a stay at home parent and found comfort in writing songs. Medical professionals wanted Zach to keep journals of his feelings, but he found it easier to put his emotions into song form. All of the songs on his debut album, "Hittin the Ground Runnin", are based from real experiences and difficult periods in his life. Burns, for example, tells the story of dealing with aftermath of losing his daughter, Harper, who was born with a Diaphragmatic Hernia and passed away at only seventeen days old. In the song he talks about coming home to find his wife on the closet floor with a picture of Harper on her chest and tears streaming down her face even though she was asleep. The raw emotion of the lyrics and the transparency of the storyline is what, he feels, made this song appealing. It was the single for his album and was the first song to receive radio play. Something as an Indie country artist, he didn't expect to happen. it was then that he realized, "three or four chords and the truth is the best way for me to write a song. No BS, no beating around the bush, just my story and a melody to back it up. "Zach loves his family, his fans, and his country and appreciates everything life has shown him, good and bad.
