## Homework Folders and Envelopes

Your child will be bringing home their homework folder and planner everyday. They are responsible for writing their homework in their planner in class. Incomplete work will also be sent home to complete. Please check their homework folders daily to check for notes and returned assignments. This is also an easy way for you to send items such as notes, lunch orders, and messages to me when necessary.

Homework generally consists of reading for 20 minutes a day, completing one math lesson, and one spelling activity each night.

Monday Envelope- Please take ALL papers out of your student's Monday envelope, sign the front, and return it the following day.

## Class Dojo and Website:

I will be using Class Dojo to align with our classroom behavior chart and notify parents of important information. A weekly newsletter will be posted on the class website each Monday morning. #### Classroom Expectations and Policies

Establishing good classroom discipline is essential to each child's success, confidence and well-being. Our class will focus on rewarding good behaviors in order to promote a positive environment in the classroom. However, if class rules are broken appropriate consequences will follow: such as time away from certain classroom activities, written and/or verbal apologies, and/or conduct slips. The idea is for the consequence to be related to the misbehavior and act as a solution or restitution for the problem. If classroom rules are severely or persistently broken, parents will be contacted. A visit to the principal's office is used as a last resort option.
