## Hunger Solutions of the Mid-Ohio Valley donates \$10,000 to Mountaineer Food Bank

(Marietta, OH) – COVID-19 has resulted in more people and families needing the assistance of their local food pantries. Hunger Solutions of the Mid-Ohio Valley recently donated \$10,000 to Mountaineer Food Bank for usage in Wood county, West Virginia. All these funds were raised locally to assist in the fight against hunger.

Mountaineer Food Bank's mission is to feed West Virginia's hungry through a network of member feeding programs and engage our state in the fight to end hunger. They support 48 of West Virginia's 55 counties, including Wood county.

Hunger among children has a major impact on not only health care costs later in life, but also educational achievement, worker productivity and eventually the ability of the region and nation to compete in a global economy.

Since its inception in 2012 Hunger Solutions of the Mid-Ohio Valley has contributed over \$350,000 to provide nutritional food to those in need and over \$60,000 to help provide nutrition education to over 2000 children in our communities.
