

Pioneers & Patriots: A 2-Day Journey Through Missouri's Civil War and Trailblazing History

Day 1 - Trails West & the Frontier

Morning:

National Frontier Trails Museum – Independence, MO
 Explore exhibits dedicated to the Santa Fe, Oregon, and California Trails, featuring authentic covered wagons, trail artifacts, and original diaries.

Pioneer Spring Cabin at Courthouse Square

Visit the restored Pioneer Spring Cabin, symbolizing the starting point for many pioneers heading west.

Midday:

- Lunch in Independence Square Enjoy local eateries like Square Pizza or Café Verona.
- **Bingham-Waggoner Estate** *Independence, MO*Tour this 26-room mansion situated along the Santa Fe Trail, offering insights into 19th-century life.

Afternoon:

Fort Osage National Historic Landmark – Sibley, MO
 Explore this reconstructed 1808 fort established by William Clark, offering panoramic views of the Missouri River.

Evening:

- Drive to Lexington, MO (~45 min)
 - Battle of Lexington State Historic Site Learn about the 1861 Civil War battle, known for the "Battle of the Hemp Bales."
 - Website
 - Anderson House Visit this 1853 mansion that served as a Union hospital during the battle, still bearing battle scars.

Overnight Suggestions:

• Stay in *Independence, Blue Springs*, or *Lexington* depending on preference.

Day 2 - Civil War Skirmishes & the Pony Express

Morning:

Battle of Westport Visitor Center – Kansas City, MO
 Discover the largest Civil War battle west of the Mississippi, often referred to as the "Gettysburg of the West."

• Loose Park Walking Tour – Stroll through the park that was once a battlefield, now featuring Civil War markers and a beautiful rose garden.

Midday:

- Lunch near the Country Club Plaza Dine at local favorites like Gram & Dun or Rye
 KC.
- John Wornall House Museum Kansas City, MO
 Built in 1858, this home served as a field hospital during the Battle of Westport and offers insights into civilian life during the war.

Afternoon:

• Drive to Lone Jack, MO (~45 min)

 Lone Jack Civil War Museum & Battlefield – Explore artifacts, dioramas, and the soldiers' cemetery from the 1862 battle.

Evening:

 Optional scenic drive to Fort Scott National Historic Site (~1.5 hrs from Lone Jack)

Visit this well-preserved frontier fort that played roles in both westward expansion and the Civil War.

Alternative if staying local:

• Spend the evening in **Weston**, **MO** – a charming 1800s town with local shops, wineries, and the *Weston Bend State Park overlook*.

m Bonus Stops You Could Add

• Mahaffie Stagecoach Stop – Olathe, KS

Experience a working 1860s farm with stagecoach rides and living history demonstrations.

• Watkins Woolen Mill State Historic Site – Kearney, MO

Tour the only 19th-century textile mill in the U.S. with its original machinery still intact.

• Liberty Arsenal Site - Liberty, MO

Visit the site of a significant early Civil War skirmish, known as the "Fort Sumter of Missouri."
