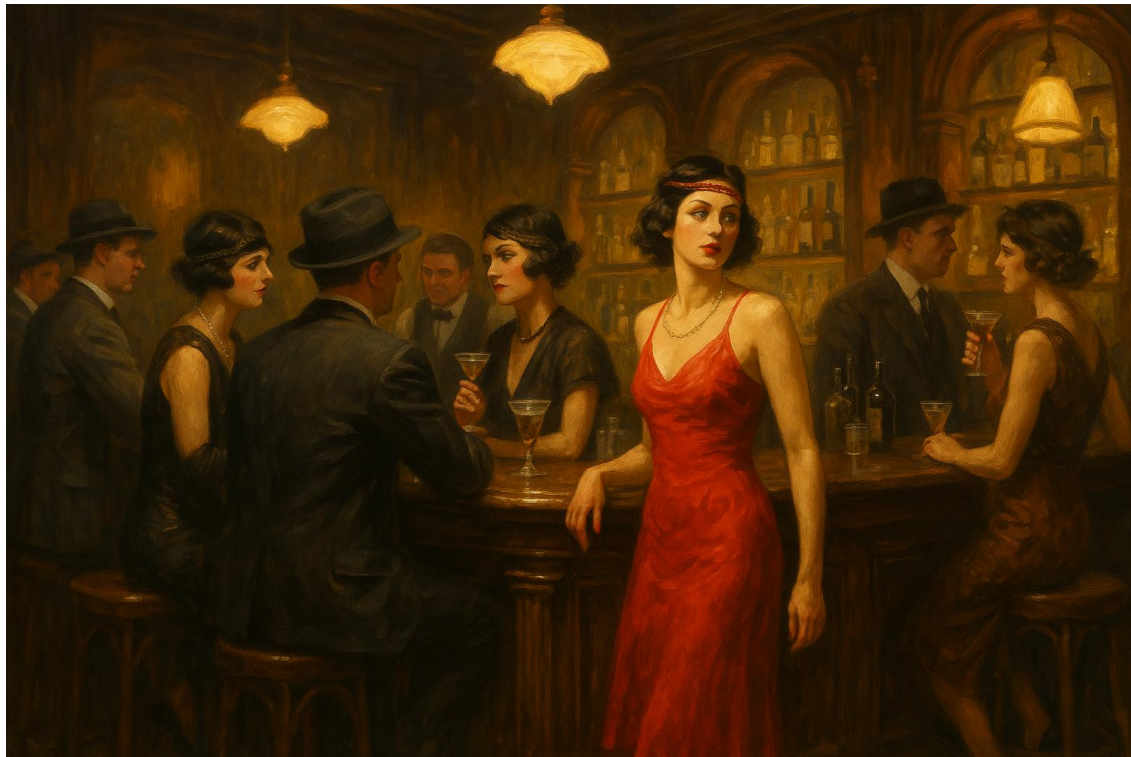

Morning:
