



- 1. How long have you been DJing? I have been DJing for 7 years, doing weddings for the past 5 years.
- 2. What type of equipment do you use? Only top of the line professional DJ equipment.
- **3.** Do you have any backup plans if something goes wrong or happens to the DJ? Proper planning is the best way to prevent something from going wrong. However, in the case of an emergency, a trusted industry professional would fill in under the rare circumstance that I am unable to attend the event. In addition, I always have a backup system on site should something fail.
- **4. Will the DJ play requests?** I will only play requests if you allow it. If allowed, they will be "mentally filtered" to make sure it's not something you specifically asked not to play or genre you asked not to play. If the request is a solid request that makes sense or is something that can be played a few songs down the road, I will gladly play it.
- 5. Can we request songs for the DJ to play? Definitely! In fact, I encourage coming up with at least 15 songs that you "must hear," and few songs you don't want to hear. The online planning system makes this process simple.
- 6. Can we provide our own music for the DJ to play? Sure, if that's what you want to hire me for! The only stipulation is that I receive the music file(s) at least a month in advance. When doing this, please think of the audience attending your event.
- 7. What are your payment terms? A 15% deposit is required at the time of booking and the remaining balance is due two weeks prior to the event date. Payments can be made through the online planning system using a debit or credit card or PayPal account, or by mailing a check.
- **8.** Do I tip the DJ? Gratuity is not included in the final contracted price. 10-20% is generally recommended if your expectations have been exceeded, but it is entirely up to you.
- **9. Will the DJ play overtime if needed?** Yes, of course! However, payment for playing past the contracted time is due at that time if at all possible.
- **10. When should we book a DJ?** A good time frame is at least 6-12 months out for a wedding, less time for other events. However, if I am available for a last-minute event, I will be happy to rock it as well!
- **11. Should we feed the DJ?** This is not required in our contract and is completely up to you. Typically, the catering director or event coordinator will set aside a meal for the DJ if requested by the client.
- **12. What other services do you offer?** Other services include but are not limited to: ceremony audio, cocktail hour audio, custom song edits, lighting (uplighting/dance floor lighting/intelligent lighting with trussing), custom or stock GOBO projection, TV slide show, dancing in the clouds, etc. YOUR Vision, OUR Mission we got what you need.
- **13.** How many songs should I request? Ideally, at least 15 songs of different genres and artists you would like to hear, as well as songs/artists you don't want to hear. This allows me to get an idea of what music you'd like for different parts of the event.
- **14.** Are you insured? Yes, I am fully insured and can easily provide a "proof of insurance certificate" should your venue require one.
