

As I reflect on the past year, I am reminded of the profound impact of neighbors helping neighbors. 40% of islanders do not earn enough to meet basic daily needs. **We have remained steady in our commitment to bridge this gap.**

Through grant opportunities and devoted donors, we've added new programs - Orcas Money Smart Financial Literacy, a Diaper Bank, and a program to increase access to health services for Spanish speakers. We also focused on advocacy to secure county funds for housing support services. **There's more work to be done.**

Looking ahead, we are elated to begin the design of a facility for the Resource Center at the new nonprofit community campus. When complete, the campus will

be located on the Pea Patch property, which is within walking distance of 80+ income-constrained homes, allowing for ease of service access.

The co-location with OPAL and the Food Bank will allow collaboration with community partners to better serve island residents. **What a huge benefit to islanders creating a lasting legacy for generations to come!**

We still have a long way to go! Thank you for being a part of our journey and supporting our commitment to fostering a healthy community.


