Among these programs have been "The Bugaloos," the second network production ("H. R. Pufnstuf" was the first) by the creative Krofft puppeteers, and "The Tomfoolery Show," the first program to present the poetic works of Edward Lear in their original form. "The Bugaloos," featuring Martha Raye, is set against a fantasy background and mixes music with tales of adventure. "Tomfoolery" uses imaginative illustrations to give shape and depth to Lear's characters.

"The Bugaloos" will continue in the 1971-72 season, and "Tomfoolery" will become part of "Take a Giant Step."

Also returning for its second season is "Doctor Dolittle," the animated version of the popular children's stories by Hugh Loftig, featuring a veterinarian who can talk to animals. The program includes contemporary music played by "The Grasshoppers."
