## Young Performers Become 'Bugaloos'

Four young performers have been signed for "Bugaloos," new costume-comedy-musical series created by Sid and Marty Krofft, to be presented on the NBC Television Network Saturday mornings starting this fall.

The four, who will star as the Bugaloos, a group of teenage musicians, are Caroline Ellis, 19, as Joy; John Philpott, 21, as Courage; John McIndoe, 22, as I.Q.; and

Wayne Laryea, 18, as Harmony. All are from England except McIndoe, who is from Scotland.

Miss Ellis played Louise in the London production of "The Sound of Music." Philpott was a drummer-vocalist for two years with a British pop group. He had been working as a trousers presser in a factory for the past six months.

McIndoe was brought up in the circus where he worked as a clown, rider and assistant to his parents in their trapeze act. He was a member of a London pop group that lived and worked for a time in Sweden and has been employed as an elevator operator.

Laryea, youngest of the four, has appeared on the stage and in television.

The four were chosen from among hundreds of talented candidates auditioned by the Kroffts on two recent talent-scouting trips to London.
