Famed designer George Barris of Hollywood will have his latest innovation, "The Bugaloo Buggy," on display — plus other unique machines created as only he, the recognized king of the customizing industry, can create them.

The gates at the Santa Clara County Fairgrounds will open this morning at 11 o'clock, and will remain open until 10 p.m. tonight.

More than 200 sparkling, customized entries will be on display.

There will be a bit of something for everyone. The ladies, too, will be interested in the fact that there will be a band contest tonight — and the men will be interested as well. And two other attractions — in addition to all the customized ma-

chines — beckon to the men. They are a weight-lifting contest this afternoon at 3 o'clock, and San Jose Speedway super-modified champion Bill Scott will display his brilliant blue "number five" race car and talk about racing.
