



Bouncing Bugaloos

One of the cars which will go on display at the Fresno Autorama March 11 through 14 will be the Bugaloos Buggy (above).

The machine was made for use in a television series by the George Barris company in Los Angeles.

The vehicle was made from a fun buggy four-passenger plastic body. It is equipped with a low-horsepower engine that is advertised as smog

free. The body has futuristic lines, capped with a curved windshield.

The TV story calls for the car to fly, it is equipped with two flapping butterfly wings. And to make it seaworthy, the bottom of the machine is enclosed, with two propellers installed at the rear of the body.

The headlights are designed to look like the eyes of a bug and the taillights are tunneled

port holes that light up at night.

Promoter Blackie Gejeian said 2,000 Bugaloo wings, similar to those worn by actors in the TV series, will be given away at the autorama.

Other customized cars as well as boats and motorcycles will be on display at the autorama.
