ESS Services & Universal Screener: Kirkpatrick

Appropriate attention to mental health & security

Tier I: professional development & parent workshops

Tier II: added counselors in high school & middle school (1 per level that travels to each school)

Tier III:

Bridges at North- south contained

Dual Diagnosis- autism with behavioral support

Mainstreamed with IEP at South: wraparound (variety of supports- parents, group)

Thorne: IEP with significant mental health needs

Nothing currently (21/22) on elementary levels

Required trainings for building staff- anyone that starts beginning of year must complete by 9/30

Fit to Return: guardian completes the day after incident for the

Pilot for Universal Screener- hope to start in October

This is guardian permission

Mental Health Committee currently meets quarterly

New Counseling Committee to meet regularly next school year

Social/Emotional Curriculum to begin

Student forums at high schools

Every school at the end of next year will have a dog in it for emotional support

3 days a week to ease children with immediate need for TLC

Peer Leaders in Middle School (application process)

Kindergarten 22/23

Bonus orientation (bus/craft/story) has always been PTA driven

September orientation prior to school start is school run standard

Readiness skills may not be present such as past years (shutdown=less schooling)

Infuse social emotional goals into a more structured K expectation

Harmony pilot prek program

Creative Curriculum helps with mixed abilities

Fairview received technical grant

New Monmouth received co-teaching grant

Inclusion Specialist to work with co-teachers across the district

Middle school- resource kids often get thrown into self contained in other courses due to schedule

Goal to keep their days mainstreamed with assistance

MFoDL to support prek & K families- tend to attract older student's families
