The observance of Plough Sunday on the First Sunday of Epiphany goes back to Victorian times, but behind it there is a much older observance, associated with the first working day after the twelve days of Christmas, hence 'Plough Monday' in some places.

In medieval times some ploughs were kept in the parish church, and some churches kept a 'plough-light'. In days when work was scarce in winter, the observance looked forward to the time of sowing with the promise of a harvest to come.

Arlington and Wilmington communities have reintroduced it as a focus for asking a blessing on human labour near the start of the calendar year. God speed the plough!

January Gardener's Diary

If you're thinking of growing vegetables this year for your dinner table (and of course the local village show!) here are things you can do in the garden this January, weather permitting. Start by digging over the area you want to use, so the frosts and rain can break it down ready for spring planting. If you have a compost bin or heap, before digging, spread that over part of the area where Potatoes, Onions, Beans and Brassicas will be.

Plan what seeds you need and write a list, so you know when the best time is to sow and harvest them. Keep them in an airtight container so they stay fresh. Potatoes need to be ordered early so they can be put in trays about 6 weeks before planting for chitting. They do say that Shallots should be planted on the shortest day of the year and harvested on the longest day of the year, so give it a go if the weather is okay.

If it's not too wet, try putting Broad Beans in now for an early crop, or put them in pots to plant out later.

Recipe of the Month: Frittata with Sautéed Leeks and Brie

Serves 6

Ingredients

4 tbsp olive oil

6 medium sized leeks, trimmed, washed and thinly sliced

A grating of nutmeg

1 tsp salt

A good grinding of black pepper 10 large eggs

1 tsp Tabasco

225 g brie, sliced into 6, edge rind removed

Method

Heat 3 tbsp oil in a sauté pan and cook the sliced leeks until they are very soft.

Stir in the nutmeg and salt and pepper. Beat the eggs with the tabasco. Heat the remaining oil in an 18cm crêpe or frying pan, pour in the egg mixture - it should nearly fill the pan to the brim. Carefully fork in the leeks. Lower the temperature under the pan and let the eggs set. The mixture should not rise up the sides of the pan but if this happens, reduce the heat. When the base is firmly set, preheat the grill to medium and arrange the 6 slices of brie pointed ends towards the centre on the top of the frittata. Put the pan under the grill and leave it until the eggs have firmed up on the top. Then slip the frittata on to a serving plate and cut into wedges. Serve with salad.

The Archaeology of the Three Villages

Berwick, Alciston, and Selmeston may appear quiet and small today, but underfoot they contain chapters of very different pasts. From Mesolithic flints and Anglo-Saxon cemeteries to monastic barns and mammoth tusks, the evidence preserved in their soil links local life to national and even global narratives - of climatic change, medieval religion and human movement. Selmeston's archaeology is notable both for its long chronology and for the scale of early medieval burial remains.

Surface finds and small investigations have shown human presence here since the Mesolithic age - hunter-gatherers exploited springs and seasonal resources at least 6-8 millennia ago. More dramatically, part of an Anglo-Saxon inhumation cemetery lies beneath Manor Cottages: the site was first identified in 1897 and revisited in the mid-20th century, with a professional excavation in 1979 uncovering multiple graves, weapons and personal items.

Finds reported from the site include spearheads, knives, buckles and

other grave goods; several objects from Selmeston have been deposited or displayed in Lewes' museums. The cemetery is nationally recognised and is scheduled by Historic England. underlining the importance of Selmeston for early medieval studies in the region.

The Selmeston graves are archaeologically valuable because they speak to the period of change in Britain between the 5th and 7th centuries when settlement patterns, social organisation and material culture were being transformed after the end of Roman rule. The weaponry and graves found locally helped specialists to map the spread of Anglo-Saxon groups whose rituals and practices spread

across the Weald and downland fringe.

Alciston's archaeology is intertwined with its medieval role as a grange of Battle Abbev. The village preserves major standing remains - notably the long flint and tile tithe barn and the dovecote that are physical echoes of monastic agricultural organisation from the medieval period. Documentary sources and building archaeology show that Alciston was an important grange, and the barn itself is one of the longest in Sussex, a carved and structural witness to large-scale cereal storage and tithing systems. Excavation and building

phases of religious architecture. Beneath the east window, archaeologists recorded remains of a pre-Conquest chalk apse and other fabric, demonstrating that Alciston had an ecclesiastical presence before the Norman Conquest - probably an Anglo-Saxon church that was later replaced or rebuilt in medieval times. These stratified remains help chart how monastic landholding and parish structures grew up on older sacred places.

Berwick is best known for its medieval church, St Michael and All Angels, which stands on a site with ancient roots. The churchyard contains features interpreted as a burial mound and its fabric contains early stonework, pointing to a long continuity of worship and burial at the site. The building itself is archaeologically layered, with Saxon and medieval stonework overlain by later repairs and refurbishments.

Beyond human remains, the lowlands around Berwick - and the wider Cuckmere valley - have yielded palaeontological finds. During major earthworks to form Arlington Reservoir (constructed 1969-71 on the Cuckmere) and other deep excavations in the valley, workers and specialists recovered Pleistocene fauna: mammoth tusks, bison horn and the skull of a woolly rhinoceros have all been reported. These show that large herbivores

roamed, and were preserved, in valley sediments during glacial and interglacial cycles.

These Ice-age remains draw attention to the mixed archaeological and geological character of the Cuckmere: peat and fluvial deposits in valley bottoms can trap and preserve organic remains that long pre-date human settlement, while later agricultural use and modern construction can both expose and destroy such deposits. That sensitivity means that many civilengineering projects in the area proceed with palaeontological and archaeological monitoring.

Camouflage antithesis, these
creatures make themselves
obvious to warn incomers that
they're not to be messed with. It's
called aposematism, a defence
mechanism used by certain species
across the board: invertebrates,
plants, mammals, birds, fish and
fungi. Told you I had a point.
There are a several types of
aposematism.

Aposematic colouration

Deliberately bright colours visually to warn of a toxic taste to others (whether this is true or not). Think ladybirds, wasps and Cinnabar moth caterpillars, who are bright yellow to mirror the toxic traits taken on by their favourite food plant - Ragwort. Then there are Cuttlefish, whose colour-changing skills give them the option of disguise or bold vibrant attack.



Olfactory aposematism
Repelling predators by producing a smell or foul-smelling substance.
This dirty card is played by several

species of shield bug - sometimes harshly, but accurately known as stink bugs. Many plants are notable for this feature, including the strong-smelling Wild Garlic.

Auditory aposematism

Sound as a deterrent. Many species make alarm calls to expose a nearby predator, like a Robin tickticking at the sight of a cat. But auditory aposematism is making a sound to directly warn of one's own danger or distaste to others. A famous example is the Rattlesnake, which clatters its tail to give the heads up - "it's not worth it mate". Closer to home, the Garden Tiger moth rubs its wings together to make a rasping noise to the same effect.

Symbolic or tenuous, there's no doubt that these creatures have mastered the art of communicating their boundaries. In nature there's no awkwardness, no deeper meaning, no overthink - imagine!
So, in nature's honour, this year I'll be saying 'no' a lot more. Hopefully with no need for any olfactory assistance.
