Recycling

2024 has kicked off with the welcome news that households no longer have to pay to get rid of small-scale DIY waste at council recycling centres, boosting recycling and making it easier for people to dispose of their waste in a responsible manner. The Government has abolished the fees which around one-third of local authorities, including in East Sussex, previously charged to dispose of DIY waste at household waste recycling centres (HWRCs).

All councils in England will now treat DIY waste the same as other household waste when it meets certain conditions, such as not exceeding two 50-litre rubble bags. This change has the potential to save households hundreds of pounds, with charges that were up to £10 an item, such as a piece of plasterboard, now scrapped.

Today's changes are the latest in a string of reforms to make it simpler and easier to recycle. That includes a consultation launched to make it easier to recycle household electrical items and simpler household collection rules announced in October.

Many local residents contacted me regarding these unfair charges, and I am glad that the government has listened and acted. This will hopefully reduce the instances of rogue traders collecting DIY waste and then fly-tipping it. This is part of the wider Government aim to tackle waste crime and fly-tipping, which is estimated to cost the economy £924m per year in England. Among other measures, grants totalling £775,000 were announced last year to help councils roll out a range of projects to crack down on fly-tipping, with an additional £1m for grants being made available this year.

February's Gardener's Diary

Spring is getting closer, so we need to start thinking about what to do in the vegetable garden during February.

Keep your egg boxes for chitting your seed Potatoes, which can now be placed in a cool dark place so they can start sprouting.

Broad Beans can be put into pots and then in the greenhouse, cold frame, or indoors on the windowsill. When they are strong enough plant them in the garden.

Sow Onion, Leek and Tomato seeds in trays and again put them in the greenhouse or similar to germinate.

Shallots can be planted into the garden now if you have good drainage, if not wait until it is drier; they will soon catch up.

As the weather has been kind to the garden this winter hopefully everyone has spread their compost and dug it in. A tip for early sowing, if you have an area prepared, is to cover it with black plastic to keep it drier and warmer in preparation for spring planting.

Recipe of the Month: Mary Berry's West Country Gratin

Ingredients

450 g piece of bacon
450 ml dry cider
50 g butter
2 celery sticks - thinly sliced
225 g white of leek - thinly sliced
50 g plain flour
300 ml warm milk
225 g cooked carrots - sliced
225 g cooked, peeled potatoes -

Salt and pepper 50 g cheddar - grated 50 g parmesan - grated

Method

In a pan with a well-fitting lid, add the bacon and pour in the cider. Bring to the boil, lower to simmering point. Then cover and cook gently for about 30 minutes or until cooked and really tender. Remove the bacon from the pan and leave to cool.

Return the pan to the heat and boil the cider juices, if not too salty, until reduced to 300 ml. Leave on one side.

Heat the butter in a large pan and stir in celery and leek and fry for a minute. Cover and cook gently for 10 minutes.

Sprinkle in the flour, stir and take the pan off the heat before gradually stirring in the milk followed by the reduced cider. Bring to the boil stirring. Simmer for 1 to 2 minutes and then fold in the cooked vegetables and cook for a minute to heat through.

Pre-heat the grill to medium. Cut off the rind and excess fat from the bacon and cut the meat into sugar cube sized pieces. Fold these into the sauce. Season with salt and pepper.

Pour the mixture into a shallow oven-proof dish and sprinkle with the cheeses. Place under the grill until golden brown and piping hot throughout.

In 1898, two burly workmen in a chalk quarry near Lewes cracked open a hollow chunk of flint. The solid rock, formed 85 million years ago, split open to reveal an airtight cavity at its core. To the quarrymen's amazement, entombed within the ancient flint was a dead toad.

'Toad-in-the-hole' hysteria soon hit the headlines. It seemed like every month the newspapers reported how someone had split open a rock and found a toad inside. Some of these toads had already croaked but others would inexplicably still be alive and hopping. The Victorian world was thrown into theological and philosophical panic. Clergymen preached that the Creator had placed the eternal amphibians in rocks at the dawn of time. Subscribers to Darwin's new theory of evolution were perplexed. Charles Dickens wrote of his bewilderment, while others believed it was simply sorcery. Scientists began burying living toads in sealed boxes to investigate the unfortunate animal's longevity.

The Lewes Toad of 1898 is the world's only surviving artefact of the entombed toad craze. It now resides in Brighton's incredible Booth Museum of Natural History - one of my favourite places in the whole world. Amongst the many awe-inspiring exhibits at The Booth, you'll find a special

cabinet dedicated to curiosities. In it, lying reverentially on a bed of maroon felt, there is 'Probably the most famous toad in the world'. Admittedly when it comes to world-famous toads it's not a particularly crowded field, with only Toad of Toad Hall to contest the title. Alongside the original oval of cleft flint sits the shrivelled body of the infamous amphibian. The whole surreal exhibit is like a Kinder Surprise designed by Hieronymus Bosch.

But this cracked up flint isn't all it's cracked up to be. The Lewes toad was originally presented to the Brighton and Hove Natural History and Philosophical Society by Charles Dawson. That's the same Charles Dawson who would soon be sticking some Orangutan teeth on a human skull and declaring he had discovered the 'missing link' at Piltdown, near Uckfield. In 1953, Dawson would be unmasked as a fraudster and the whole 'toadin-the-hole' phenomenon would come crashing down, dismissed as poppycock.



From the Parsonage

Lent starts early this year with Ash Wednesday falling on the same day as St. Valentine's Day, 14th February. A reminder that whilst Lent begins with worshippers at this service being marked with ashes made from the burning of last year's Palm Sunday crosses, that for all its austerity, it is above everything else, about love. As a cross is made on the forehead of worshippers it is accompanied by the priest saying the words 'remember that you are but dust turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ'. This touching of the head communicates the grace of God which is given to a believer and a necessary gift without which they cannot remain disciples.

'Ash Wednesday' by T. S. Eliot is one of the great poems of the 20th Century, written during his 1927 conversion to Christianity. This year our Poet in Residence, Antony Mair, will be introducing people unfamiliar with the poem to its content. These open sessions will be on 6th, 13th, 20th March (Venue to be confirmed). And in Holy Week, the week before Easter, the actor Charles Sharman-Cox will be performing the poem in Berwick Church. He offered to do this because of the connection with Bishop Bell under whose portrait in the church he will be performing. Bishop Bell commissioned Eliot to write 'Murder in The Cathedral' for performance in Canterbury Cathedral

T.S. Eliot's conversion to Christianity was a profound moment, one which put him at odds with his Bloomsbury contemporaries, they simply couldn't understand it. The poem conveys a deep experience that Eliot's wrestles to express in words. Conversion, that inexplicable experience of change, continues to surprise individuals at unexpected moments in life.

Lent this year will be set against the backdrop of climate change. Lent is the season of simplicity and an expression of a desire to change or to use a line from Eliot's poem 'And pray to God to have mercy on us'. On Ash Wednesday, on Valentine's Day we might ask ourselves, 'Do we love the world enough to save it'? Peter Blee
