


great fun on the day, numerous and beautiful entries, and boundless good cheer!

Sussex benefices. The book can be used as a companion to the walk or allow people to travel the terrain from their armchair.

While the poems trace this trip from Berwick, with its astounding Bloomsbury Group paintings, pilgrims can begin by selecting their starting point at Alfriston, Lullington, Wilmington, Arlington, Selmeston or Alciston. There are a number of features in the churches and at places on the way, such as the Wilmington Long Man, captured in various forms.

Scully spent a year in and about the path, organising several events and workshops, and has set out to show the diversity of pilgrimage in the people and places he encounters. Mark Oakley, author of the Ramsey prize winning book, The Splash of Words, writes:

'Kevin Scully's poems work like sandpaper to the soul. Unafraid to embrace the disquiet of both inner and outer landscapes, he nevertheless leads to places of epiphany and radiance. Alerting us to the locality of his residency, he makes the heart local to us too, provoking to wonder at rumours of transcendence.' The collection also has some notes on the poems that cast light on various aspects of the pieces.

Recipe of the Month: Sticky Toffee Cake

Ingredients

225 g dried dates

300 ml water

1 tsp bicarbonate of soda

175 g light soft brown sugar

115 g butter or margarine

1 tsp vanilla extract

2 eggs beaten

175 g self-raising flour

Toffee icing

6 tbsp double cream 80 g light soft brown sugar 25 g butter

25 g golden icing sugar sifted

Method

Grease and line the base of a shallow 28 by 18 cm tin. Pre-heat the oven to 350°F/180°C/gas mark 4.

Cut the dates roughly into three pieces. Place in a small pan with the water and bring to the boil and boil uncovered for about 10 minutes until the water is absorbed and the dates are softened. Remove from the heat, stir in the bicarbonate of soda, and leave to cool.

Cream together the sugar, butter or margarine and vanilla extract. Gradually beat in the eggs; then fold in the dates and the flour.

Spoon the mixture into the tin, level the surface and make a slight dip in the centre. Bake for about 35 minutes until risen and just set. It may be necessary to cover the cake for the last 10 minutes as the dates are liable to burn

Remove from the oven and leave in the tin for 15 minutes before turning out on to a wire rack to cool.

For the icing gently heat the cream, sugar and butter together in a small pan until the sugar dissolves. Bring to the boil and cook uncovered for about 4 minutes until golden. Do not stir. Take the mixture off the heat if it darkens too much. Leave to cool. When cold, beat in the icing sugar until smooth. Using a wet palette knife, spread it over the cake.

Leave to set before cutting.

The Government wants to end this and make appointment bookings much easier for patients. GPs provide NHS services independently, so they are not required to take part in these national schemes. That said, in recent months more than one thousand general practices have signed up for the national digital phone upgrades - backed by funding of £240 million – meaning that, once installed, patients no longer hear engaged tones when they contact their practice.

The new phone system will mean that calls can be diverted to the right place, whether that is for appointment booking or repeat prescriptions and patients no longer have to wait for long periods to try and get through. One of the practices in Seaford has invested in this innovative technology and seen their call times reduce from around 40 minutes to 12-15 minutes. It is expected every practice in the country will have the new system in place by the end of this financial year, helping put an end to the 8.00 am rush.

Patients will be able to contact their general practice more easily and quickly and find out exactly how their request will be handled on the day they call, rather than being told to call back later, in line with the primary care recovery plan announced in May. If their need is urgent, they will be assessed and given appointments on the same day. If it is not urgent, appointments should be offered within 2 weeks, or patients will be referred to NHS 111 or a local pharmacy.

I fully recognise the strength of feeling patients have in trying to call on the phone to make an appointment, and the use of digital phone technology will support GP practices to make it easier for people to get through and get the query dealt with more quickly.

October's Gardener's Diary

This month it's mainly preparation for next year's crops, but first a few tips on getting more from this year's plants. If you grew peas this year, just cut off the top and leave the roots in the ground. As they rot,

they release nitrogen, which will be good for next year's crops.

When you cut cabbages, leave the roots in the ground, and cut across the top with a knife. This will encourage new leaf growth.

Plant your garlic this month for a bumper crop next year and autumn onions can now be planted as well. For the rest of the month get clearing off any weeds and perhaps prepare trenches for beans in the spring, digging in manure at the same time. Lisa Collington

Family Support Work (FSW)

I seem to write this in every update, but we really are incredibly busy at the moment. With things returning to routine after the summer, our practitioners are hugely involved in very complex cases and trying to help families achieve lasting change in very challenging circumstances. Financial hardship, mental health issues and parenting challenges are the three most pressing problems at the moment, none of which are quick to resolve. We received over twenty new referrals in September which we are having to put on waiting lists as demand is still exceeding our capacity.

Harvest season is upon us, and we know that many of you will generously be collecting items for our foodbank, for which we send enormous thanks. Our stock levels are still pretty low, so we are in need of most items. If you would like a member of FSW staff to come and talk at a church service or any other event then do let us know, as we would be delighted to do so if we can. Hoverflies

Everyone loves bees, don't they? Knowing that our bees are in decline has prompted protests and petitions and highlighted the important service these buzzing pollinators provide to our planet. Without them our crops and ecosystems would collapse. Yet many other pollinators that provide the same service don't get the same level of public support. So today I'm waving my flag for the hoverflies.



For some reason, they're not as loveable as bees. Perhaps it's because most of the time people mistake them for wasps. This isn't totally our fault because that's exactly what the hoverflies want you to think. The 283 species of hoverfly in the UK come in many shapes, colours and sizes but most of them sport yellow and black stripes, making them easily confused for wasps, bees, hornets and bumblebees. It's a strategy called Batesian mimicry and was first proposed by Leicestershire lepidopterist Henry Bates in 1861. Hoverflies are harmless. They don't sting and can't bite but they have discovered you don't actually have to be dangerous to deter predators - you just have to look like something that's dangerous.



Yet their devious mimicry isn't the most incredible thing about them. Their wings are the things. Hoverflies (like all flies) have just two wings (half as many wings as bees and wasps). Whereas other flies keep their wings straight, hoverflies incline

theirs to create an angled downward stroke at a remarkable rate of 120 beats per second. This allows hoverflies to fly to a most amazing place: nowhere. Hoverflies have become the motionless masters of mid-air.

It's not all sitting around in the sky though. During their few days of life, hoverflies fight, fornicate and feed and, while busy collecting energy-giving nectar and protein-rich pollen, they inadvertently provide that vital pollination service to our flowers and crops. And hoverflies have earned the title of 'The Gardeners Friend' because about 40% of them have a larval stage which is basically a tiny crawling stomach that roams around your flowerbed eating aphids. Pollination, pest control – next thing you know these beneficial little insects will be mowing the front lawn for us too.

So why not thank these friendly flies by planting some of their favourite flowers in your garden - parsley, fennel, borage, hebe, sedum and alliums - and consider putting in a pond no matter how small. Do your bit for the pollinators and they'll keep the world working for us.

From the Vicarage

We could say that our lives are formed by four principal relationships. These are: our relationship with others, our relationship with ourselves, our relationship with the natural world, and our relationship with God. Those who don't believe in God but consider themselves spiritual may choose to talk about 'a sense of something greater than themselves' or 'moments of awareness of a transcendent dimension'. It is reported that most people say they have a 'spiritual' dimension but aren't necessarily religious. We can think of the differing importance that each of these plays in different people's lives amongst those who we know.

In the Christian tradition there is an emphasis on putting others before ourselves, but it's balanced by the need also to love ourselves: 'love your

neighbour as yourself'. Matthew 12:31 And in the matter of our relationship with others, it places forgiveness as an essential act – both forgiving others and seeking forgiveness ourselves: 'But whoever has been forgiven little, loves little.' Luke 7:47. Forgiveness is a healing action which can be applied to each of these four relationships.

The Cuckmere Pilgrim Path provides an opportunity to exercise mind, body and spirit, and to do so in relation to these four relationships and in the spirit of seeking forgiveness and reconciliation in each. Walking on our own and putting aside the business of life provides the space for us to connect with ourselves again. Walking with others opens up conversations and strengthens our relationship with them.

Walking through the landscape, feeling the ground beneath our feet, enjoying the beauty of the landscape reconnects us with the natural world.

And the churches provide places where we can be reminded of the importance of our spiritual life in community and our relationship with God, with that which is greater than ourselves and which transcends all and connects everything in space and time.

Last year we appointed a Poet in Residence, Kevin Scully, for the Cuckmere Pilgrim Path. His tenure concluded in July with the publication of a pamphlet of poems titled 'For the Journey'. This is now available - see Kevin's article. Last month we appointed a new Poet in Residence, the Hastings based Antony Mair. He will be organising workshops and other events over the course of the year. Poetry expresses our deeper thoughts and feelings and through our imagination awakens our spiritual life. The Poet in Residence is one of the ways that we're developing the Cuckmere Pilgrim Path to help people make the most of their walk as a reflective and creative experience that touches the spirit and fosters reconciliation in these four important relationships in life.
