Although the international Pandemic problem has effected everyone, we must tell you this ministry has been horribly affected too. Our income to support the Crisan work in Romania has seen an income drop from \$3,500 a month to just \$800 per month now. That is not enough to survive on. Dove House workers are often without payroll. Natural gas, water, food enough for Dove House & Bethany House, all these are left wanting. But most of all Paul & Cami need fuel and auto maintenance to keep ministering the gospel. He preaches in streets and alleys again and keeps the pastors together on the internet. It is a critical time, please pray and help as you can.



We know you are a praying and believing people, and we need you to pray now. In many areas they will need to rebuild again. Paul and pastor leaders have met daily online and often multiple times per day. They pray together, share God's Word & lift each other up in song and scripture. No sickness is too great for our Lord. That day a husband of one family was in jail for cutting a limb off a tree to have heat for his family. The reason for my tears was not just for him but when I woke I looked outside and it was snowing...just like in the picture above. All I could think of was those children. It tried to buy wood for the entire village only to be told it would cost \$1,000 USD for only 1 cord of wood. Homes like the above are all over Romania in small Gypsy villages. There are up to 4 million Gypsies in Romania and 300,000 children living in the streets with no home.



Recently most of one entire village was burned badly. Many homes were too badly burned to live in. Paul and Cami Crisan sprung into action. They assess the situation and quickly found a public center to bring the homeless to feed them. The center also had rooms and they agreed to take in the homeless during the tragedy. Regularly food was brought to them as the Crisan's worked almost night and day to secure safety for the people. Local churches helped distribute food, clothing and bedding during a cold winter until a better place can be found. Thanks to you and your continued support the Crisan's can continue to work for others in need. Thank you for being a part of this ministry and for your continued support.
