At our last meeting on Thursday, 23 May 46, Brigadier Dougherty was again present; and towards the end of the meeting, we were pleased to hear him "say a few words". Referring to his political activities, Mr. Dougherty (at this point the Brigadier added that he had no objections as to what he was called provided that it was not by rank) said he was anxious to ensure that his political plans should NOT in any way affect his relations with the Association or its individual members; and that he would not allow his actions to be in any way connected with the 2/4 Battalien.

He mentioned that he had definite reasons for interesting himself in the Australian political affairs, and emphasised the importance which he placed on the need for us to become more intelligently interested in the pelitics of the country. In concluding, Mr. Dougherty added that he valued the many friendships which the war years had given him and that he would not allow

differences of political opinion to injure such friendships. "We have fought for a cause which we called Freedom," he said, "and it is in the interests of this cause, and in order that we might enjoy that free and happier Australia for which we fought, that I have taken this course."
