NOTICE OF MOTION TO THE CONSTITUTION OF 2/4 BN. ASSOCIATION Proposed by Cec. (Slim) Powers

- " AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 5(B).
- "i. Any member of the Association who is or should become incapacitated as a result of war service shall be entitled to Honorary Life Membership of the Association. T.P.I. members shall be void of Annual Subscriptions.
- "ii. All widows of deceased service personnel who served with 2/4 A ... Inf. Bn. shall be entitled to Honorary Life Membership of the Association.
- "iii. Any person or persons recommended by the Committee and elected by the majority of members present at an Annual General Meeting or Extraordinary General Meeting shall be entitled to Honorary Life Membership of the Association.
- "iv. All Honorary Life Members shall be entitled to attend any Annual General Meeting, Extraordinary General Meeting or Monthly Meeting of the Association. Honorary Life Members (except T.P.I. Members) shall be void of voting powers.
 - " AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 5(e)
- "i. All members of 19Bde., 2/8 Inf. Bn. and 2/11 Inf. Bn. acceptable to the Executive Committee shall be entitled to Honorary Membership of the Association.
- "ii. Any person or persons nominated by a member of the Association and acceptable to the Executive Committee shall be entitled to Honorary Membership of the Association.
- "iii. All Honorary Members shall be entitled to attend any Annual General Meeting, Extraordinary General Meeting or Monthly Meeting of the Association Void of voting powers."
