ASSOCIATION OF 4th INFANTRY BATTALIONS ANNUAL MARCH, WREATHLAYING AND RE-UNION REMEMBRANCE DAY, 9th NOVEMBER, 1969

The 1969 Remembrance Sunday March to the Cenotaph Wreathlaying Ceremony and Reunion will be held on the afternoon of Sunday, 9th November.

Assembly point will be at the corner of Martin Place and Phillip Street at 2.15 p.m. The march will proceed via George Street, Bridge Street and Macquarie Place to the Gallipoli Legion of Anzacs' Club in Loftus Street, where the Reunion will commence at 4 p.m.

The magnificent band of the 4 R.N.S.W.R. will lead the parade and will entertain with a bracket of marches in Macquarie Place. Later members will render suitable musical items at the Gallipoli Legion Club.

An armed detachment of 50 men will be provided by 4 R.N.S.W.R., and the flags and banners of all our

units will be carried on the march.

Men unable to march will be catered for by cars waiting near the Cenotaph. All members of any 4th Infantry Battalion are invited to participate. Sir Ivan has been invited to lead the parade and W/O. Norm Harries, 4 R.N.S.W.R., will be the Marshal.

Any member of your executive committee will undertake to procure them for you. Inclusive cost of food and refreshment (and transport for those unable to march) is only \$2.
