THE LAYING UP OF THE QUEEN'S AND REGIMENTAL COLOURS OF THE

4TH INFANTRY BATTALION

"Sir Ivan Dougherty, will you honour the Regiment by carrying the 4th Infantry Battalion Queen's Colour to the Altar, and will you now receive the Colour from my hand, Sir?"

"Lt. Colonel Murray, will you honour the Regiment by carrying the 4th Infantry Battalion Regimental Colour on which are emblazoned Battle Honours won by the 4th Infantry Battalion, . . ."

The foregoing are excerpts from the order of service for the Colours Ceremony.

The Colours of the 4th Infantry Battalion were laid up by the 4th Infantry Battalion (Australian Rifles) in Christchurch, Cootamundra, on Sunday, July 31, 1960.

The Association of 4th Infantry Battalions has now successfully sought the removal of the Colours from Cootamundra to the Garrison Church of the 4th Battalion, St. Anne's Church of England at Strathfield.

The co-operation of the Rectors, Canon B. Boddington, of Christchurch, and the Reverend Angus Tipping, of St. Anne's, has been the major factor in effecting the removal.

St. Anne's, 42 Homebush Road, Strathfield, is a lovely cathedral-like church and on Sunday, March 14, 1971, at 1500 hours the Queen's and Regimental Colours of the 4th Infantry Battalion will be received by the Rector, the Reverend A. C. Tipping, Th.L., from the president of the Association of the 4th Infantry Battalions, Mr. H. E. C. Gjedsted.

This ceremony will coincide with a combined church parade of the 4th Battalion R.N.S.W.R. and the Association of 4th Infantry Battalions.

Invitations to attend have been extended to the Assocation's patron, Major-General Sir Ivan Dougherty, and Lady Dougherty, Lady Mackay, Lt.-Col. J. C. Hughes, M.C., Commanding Officer, 4th Battalion R.A.R., Mr. Edward Kenna, V.C., Major-General P. A. Cullen, Mrs. D. McAlpine, widow of Captain McAlpine, of the original battalion, Captain George Cartwright, V.C., together with other ladies and gentlemen prominently associated with the battallion.

The parade will assemble at the Homebush Army

Depot at 1400 hours. The depot is in Station Street -right beside the railway station.

Significantly, this depot was the H.Q. of the 4th Infantry Battalion.

The parade will march to the music of the Regimental Band of the 4th Battalion R.N.S.W.R. from the depot to St. Anne's along the route familiar to former serving members who attended the Battalion's church parades at St. Anne's.

The service will commence at 1500 hours.

After the service the ladies of St. Anne's will provide the congregation with afternoon tea at a small charge.

This historic occasion will reveal the esprit de corps of members of all 4th Battalions now banded together in the unique Association of the 4th Infantry Battalions.
