Frank Crutchett, the Honorary Secretary of the Canberra Committee organising the 1972 Reunion, has advised Senior Vice-President Bill MacLennan:—

A provisional committee has made tentative arrangements (the committee being **John Hyles**, **Don Patterson** and myself with power to add other members) as follows:—

For Saturday, 30th September:

Registration point to be the lobby of the Coach House Hotel/Motel, McMillan Circle, Griffith, A.C.T. This will be manned from 9.30 a.m. on this day. At approximately 4 p.m. there will be a short march to the War Memorial for a wreath-laying ceremony. Negotiations for a band have not yet been finalised, but will be satisfactorily concluded. (It is hoped to obtain the Royal Military College, Duntroon Band.)

The reunion dinner will be held at the Training Centre of the 3rd Bn. R.N.S.W.R. (Allara St., City), a short distance from the War Memorial. Catering arrangements have been made on what are considered to be most favourable terms.

Dinner will be followed by dancing, with refreshments available during the evening.

For Sunday, October 1st:

A sick parade will be organised, but the venue has not yet been determined. This will be no problem as if suitable club facilities are not available the A.C.T. hotels trade on a Sunday.

It is proposed to arrange the choice of several activities during the day (e.g. conducted or bus tour to points of interest, visit to War Memorial etc.). In any event, the day will culminate in a barbecue — most likely at **John Hyles'** property.

For Monday, 2nd October:

The provisional committee has not yet fully discussed the activities for this day. However, as there are four golf courses and seven bowling clubs in Canberra, suitable arrangements can be made once the wishes of those attending are known.
