THE "HORSE-DOCTOR" SAYS NEIGH!

Our thanks to Frank Cruchett for the following excerpts from the Canberra Times under the heading of "Predictions of Pollution Problem Unfair". Predictions that Canberra was facing a pollution problem were a little unfair on the people of Canberra, according to the former director of the conservation

and agricultural branch of the Department of the Capitol Territory, Mr. Jack Huston.

Mr. Huston, who will be 65 in November, retired 13 days ago, after about five years as director and almost 30 years in the N.S.W. and Commonwealth Public Service.

"Why should people worry about something that might not happen?" he said yesterday.
"Personally I don't think its much of a problem at the present time and you can't say with total accuracy what might happen in 10 years time. By then there might be a petrol shortage and there might not be as many cars and trucks on the road."

Mr. Huston, who has lived in Canberra since 1957, said the most satisfying event during his time as director was getting the Tidbin billa Nature Reserve established.
