The children who first benefitted from the fund have all gone into their tertiary studies and will graduate this year. However, the Sisters in our girl's high school here had made an approach to see if something could be done to assist some needy cases at present in high school, so we helped three little girls from remote areas of the Province. these are in their second year at High School and come from families where there is very little money. The father of one is dead and an uncle helps another child, but Carmela has not been able to get her fees. The other girl who is in Form 3 and doing very well with her studies comes from an area where the coffee gardens were destroyed in the last

Sepik flood - hence her difficulty. I would be grateful if this information could be passed to your members and assure them of our thanks for this assistance.
