



GRANADA THEATER'S FEBRUARY SHOW CALENDAR

(DALLAS, TX – February 2017) – We're a little less than a month old into 2017, but there's already plenty to look forward to on this month's concert calendar. What a difference a year makes – February '17 is giving February '16 a run for its money (and excitement). If the beginning of this New Year is any indication, it's going to be a fun year full of up-and-comers, noted acts, and classic favorites. Enough talk, let's get to it!

Opening the concert calendar for the month will be one half of the alternative rock group Ween. Joining him will be a handful of excellent musicians that make up **The Dean Ween Group**. It's a rotating cast of characters that touch on a portion of Ween's extensive catalogue while mixing in some of Dean Ween's own musical creativity. Fresh off his first solo album, *The Dealer Album*, Mickey Melchiondo (Dean Ween) and co. are hitting the road starting February 1st and swing through Dallas for a **February 4th** date.

Local favorite **Charley Crockett** is returning to Granada for just the second time as a headlining act. His first-ever Granada visit saw a healthy crowd welcome the South Texas native (and Davy Crockett descendent) to the blossoming Dallas local music scene with a special CD-release show. His upcoming **February 11th** show will be recorded live and stacked with impressive support including [Jacob Metcalf](#), [Mur](#), and [Tomar and the FCs](#). This area is lucky to have an artist like Charley Crockett, or as aptly described by Granada, "Elusive, rebellious and self-taught, Crockett is a true street-made original from earlier times."

One of the most anticipated events of the year falls on February 19th as [Neil Fest](#) comes to town. With only a couple Texas dates in Austin and Dallas, the lineup is full of artists paying homage to the great Neil Young. Included on Dallas' bill will be **Norah Jones, Boz Scaggs, Alison Mosshart of The Kills, Eric Pulido of Midlake, Charlie Sexton, The Flatlanders, Ericka Wennerstrom of Heartless Bastards and more special guest surprises!** It's a festival-esque lineup packed into one memorable night .

One of the last shows of the month keeps the tribute vibe going as we spotlight the legendary Beatle, George Harrison. His seminal album, *All Things Must Pass*, will be the toast of the evening featuring performances from notable local musicians for the "[All Things Must Pass \(George Harrison tribute\)](#)". And when we say "notable" musicians, we mean it; **Paul Averitt, Chad Stocklager, Chris Holt and Mike Richardson plus special guests**. Each one of them lends their excellent musicianship to bands and artists including Sorta, Hard Night's Day, Dazey Chain, Don Henley, Dashboard Confessional, Clinton Years and more!

[The Granada Theater](#) has been entertaining Dallas audiences of all ages since 1946. Located in the historic Lower Greenville neighborhood, it was originally built as a post-WWII movie theater house. After periods of neglect and years of alternating between concert venue/ movie house, it re-opened in 2004 under new ownership as a concert hall and has since amassed several awards including “Best Live Music Venue” (*Dallas Observer* 2007-11, 2015) along the way. Musical acts that have played the theater include Willie Nelson, Adele, Bob Dylan, Black Keys, Alt-J, M83, David Crosby, The Avett Brothers, ZZ Top, Graham Nash, TV On The Radio, Leon The Kills, BØRNS, Leon Russell, Dave Mason, CHVRCHES, Wolfmother, David Crosby, Tame Impala, Miike Snow, Father John Misty, Spoon, Old 97’s, Wilco, Jeff Bridges, OK Go, EL-P, Killer Mike and many more. Now in the building’s 71st year at 3524 Greenville Avenue, the Granada Theater is doing what it has done effortlessly over the last twelve years – ushering in a new generation of music fans one concert at a time.
