1. Create every day. Set aside 15 minutes every day for Art to form a creative habit. Soon that habit will be difficult to break, and you'll look forward to



the time set for making art.

- 2. Make a list. Take a "Quiet Moment" to think about your feelings and your day and write it down.
- Things That Made Me Happy
- Things I am Grateful For
- · Random things happening today
- **3.** Get rid of the stuff. How your workspace functions is a huge part of how you function as an artist. If your studio is cluttered that can stop your mojo dead in its tracks.
- **4.** Make mistakes. Often what keeps us from finding inspiration is the fear of making mistakes. even small ones. We often allow fear of doing something wrong to steal our creativity. Art is about taking risk.
- **5.** Make time for play. Play takes away restrictions and eliminates deadlines.

6. Search the web. Searching for ideas on the web is great way to find inspiration. But there is such a thing as too much inspiration.

Decided to work on just one technique.

7. Find what makes you happy. Finding something that really captures your attention is apt to be inspired you more.



- 9. Sometimes we over analyze every mark and paint stroke until we feel anything but inspired to make art. We should let go of expectations and plans and just create.
- 10. Take a walk in nature. Nothing can awaken our creative juices like a hike in the woods or a stroll on the beach; study a tree, a cloud formation, or a weed that's pushing its way through a crack in the sidewalk.

Hopefully, these tips will help you to overcome the roadblocks to your creativity and allow you to find the joy in your artwork again.

Creative Paperclay Pigs


This will be a two session class starting on April 2.
