But do we put as much effort into being a friend as we do into enjoying the friendship of others (maybe even taking it for granted)?

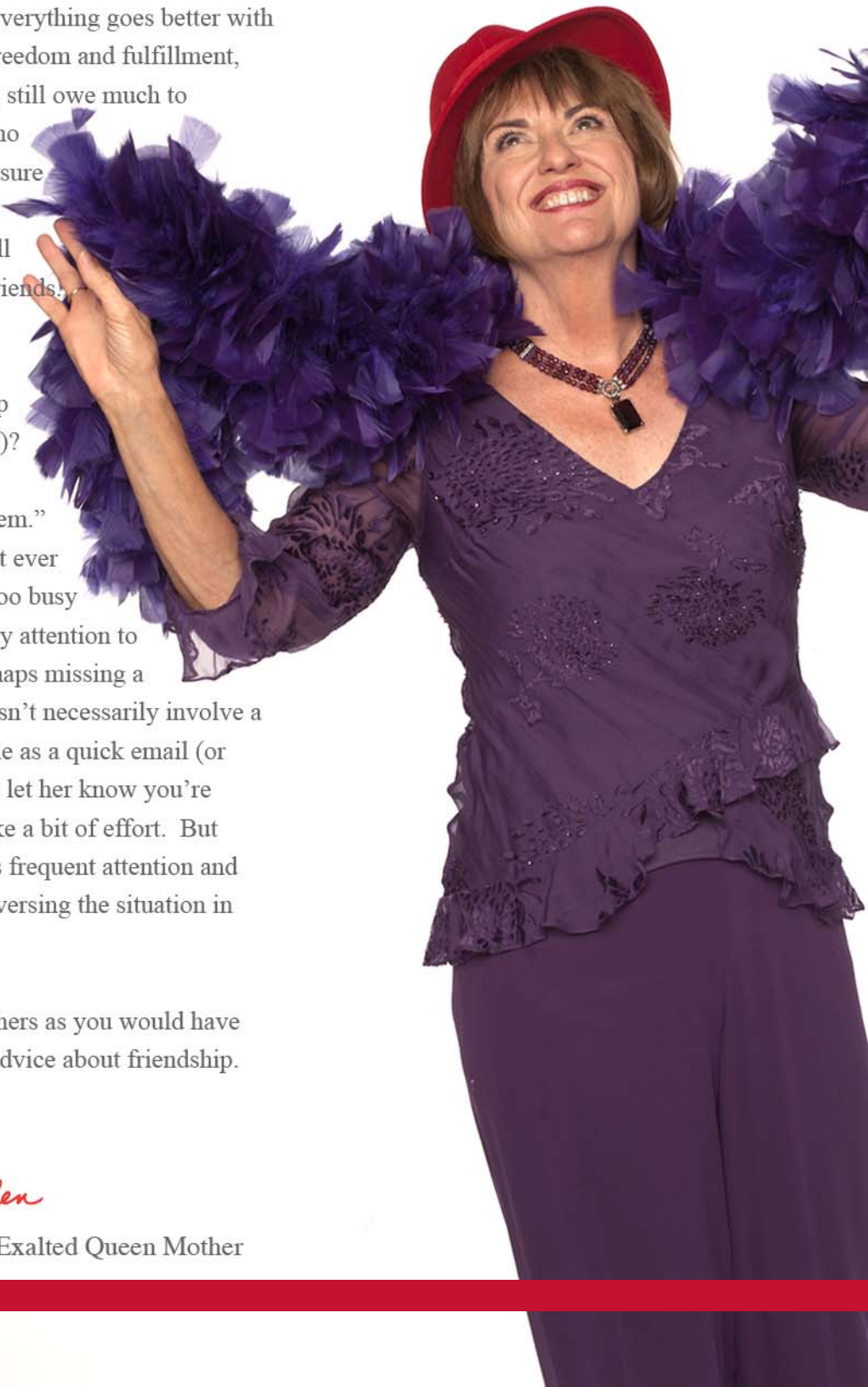

Mother-trucking

My mother, "Princess of Pokeno" Shirley Graham, is one of the most wonderful women in the world--THE most wonderful, to me! She is funny, fun-loving, gracious, warm, caring, and giving, and there is nothing more important in the world to her than her love for the Lord and for her family.

Life hasn't always been easy for her. Mother grew up in a small Louisiana town in a family of 10 children, and the family was far from "well-to-do". When she left high school, she moved to Lake Charles to work as a bookkeeper. That's where she met my father, and in 1956 they were married. Between November of 1957 and February of 1962, she had me and my three little brothers.

When I was 6 and my brothers were 5, 3, and 2 years old, our father passed away suddenly, and mother was a widow with 4 small children at the age of 27. She packed us up and moved us from New York back to her home state of Louisiana. A little over a year later, she married the wonderful man who became our "Daddy", and we also gained three great sisters in the "package"!

Daddy was in the Air Force and for the first few years after their marriage, we moved around quite a bit. Daddy got out of the Air Force in 1968 and we returned to Louisiana. Mother was a stay-at-home mom to seven children throughout our school years, and when the baby of the family was grown, she went to truck-driving school so she could drive an 18-wheeler with Daddy. Now, my mother is only about 5'3" tall and at that time weighed MAYBE 120 lbs--but that little momma could shift through 15 gears faster than you can imagine! I even wrote a song about her called "Mothertrucker"--she got a real kick out of it, too! She drove with Daddy for several years, and then decided she'd had enough and went back to stay-at-home status while Daddy continued driving.

In 1993, we lost Daddy after a very short battle with cancer, and my mother lost the love of her life. Throughout my life, I've seen my mother show strength, grace, love, and an unwavering faith in God that kept our family going through many ups and downs. I'm so proud to have her as my mother, and she's also my Red Hat sister--she was the first person I asked to join my chapter when I chartered the Bodacious Benton Belles in 2007! If you could meet my mother, you'd love her, too!

do-it-yourself Masks

If you're the type of Hatter who prefers to create rather than buy, making your own Mardi Gras mask is a cinch! First, collect some basic supplies:

- Plaster gauze (can be found online, or in many craft stores)
- Old towels
- Vaseline
- Bowl of water

Cut the plaster gauze into 3 inch by 1 inch strips. Make sure your face is clear of all makeup, and smear on a thin layer of Vaseline. Drape an old towel around your neck to protect your clothes. Dip the gauze into the water and squeeze to wring out excess liquid (only do one strip at a time!) Place the strips on your face to form the mask, smoothing the plaster out with your fingers. Don't worry about making the edge of the mask smooth: you can trim them later. You will need to do three layers: be sure to smooth the plaster out after each strip to cement it in place. Once the layers are in place, let the mask dry fully. This can take up to an hour, so have a good book or a group of chatty friends on hand to pass the time! When the mask is dry, wiggle your nose and stretch your mouth to loosen the plaster! It should pop off easily. Leave the mask in a dry place overnight to fully dry and set. Once the mask is fully dry, trim the edges with scissors to even them up. You can use a bit of sandpaper to smooth out the mask if you like. Then let loose your creative side and decorate your mask with paint, rhinestones, feathers: anything you want to use!

For extra creativity: your mask doesn't have to be flat! You can use the plaster gauze to build up any part of the face, such as eyebrows, nose, or cheekbones to give your mask a funny expression!

General Tips

Allow Supporting Members of the Society to join your chapters. All RHS Members register with the International Society through our website and then they are eligible to participate in Chapters.

Try not to be discouraged if someone you know will not pay to be a Member. Gently release them from your invitation lists and inform them that if they want to participate in activities meant for Red Hatters they are welcome to become a Supporting Member of RHS. Focus on encouraging new potential members to join RHS.

When considering new Members, recruit positive and supportive women who are truly looking for fun and friendship in their lives.

Explain the privilege of being a Supporting RHS Member. Make sure they know what their role is within the Society. It’s in the 2011 handbooks for Queens and Supporting Members.

If a Member does not use a computer, create a buddy who uses a computer to keep them up to date on RHS news.

If a Member or potential Member can’t afford regalia, share or give some to your fellow Sister.

Keep all RHS Sisters educated on what is happening on an international level. Our Friday Broadcasts are our link to each other. If you see someone in RHS regalia and find out that they are not paying members, politely explain to them the importance of supporting the Legacy. In many cases, it is simply that they have not been educated on their importance to our future.

If you encounter a Queen who speaks negatively about RHS don’t waste your time in trying to change her mind. Move on! If you are a Supporting Member, join another chapter or start your own!

Queens, if someone emails you with a request to join your local chapter, please respond to them in a timely manner.



Support Those Who Support Us

Events

It makes sense that RHS Events are for Supporting Members. Now, if you are recruiting new Members, welcome guests with open arms. Print Membership applications off of the RHS Website under "How to Join" for guests at the event to help facilitate the Membership.

If invited to outside sponsored events that target RHS Members, check out the organizers and find out if they support the RHS: if you are satisfied with what you find, support the event! You never know who you will meet at a new event. New Members are just an encounter away and the outings are always fun!



Press

If the press interviews you, please explain that you become a Member of the International Red Hat Society and then you have access to participate with chapters on a local level. Furthermore, the press can access our online press kit with all the details at www.redhatsociety.com. All press opportunities should automatically point back to the Society's main website. For your own protection, never give your personal contact information for the Society. Remember, only official Supporting Members can represent their chapters.



Support the Legacy by purchasing from the Official RHS Store (www.redhatsocietystore.com).

If you buy from other vendors, make sure they support the Society by encouraging paid Membership and that they speak positively our organization. If they are selling to us, they should be respectful of our mission. If they are positive about the RHS, support their business!

If you know of people who are taking advantage of our Members and only participating as "Members" to sell you something through the Contact chapter feature, do not support them. Immediately report SPAM to Hatquarters.

We Are Ladies

Be gracious at all times. Always speak and write positively. Did you know that whatever you write is there in cyberspace forever and represents your character?

If someone speaks negatively to you, just walk away and do not support them or their business. It is okay for some women not to want to be a part of RHS. We simply request that they not pretend to be us.

All Members have the distinguished honor of molding and defining this great Society's future for generations to come.

Circle of Cheer

A Story of *Ambassador* Friendships

We are proud to highlight several of our RHS Ambassadors and Members who have gathered together to create something breathtaking.

*It's a well known fact that the Red Hat Society brings women together in magical ways who might never have known each other. But who knew that becoming an RHS Ambassador would act like a magnet to draw such a creative group of women to work side-by-side toward a warm-hearted goal. They've created a **circle of cheer!***

First, you may know that the primary goal of a RHS Ambassador is outreach to new potential Members. With joy, they share our mission with the masses! Ambassadors may do membership drives at events, meet 'n greets and of course, they are known for handing out a referral card to everyone that they meet.

This circle of cheer no beginning nor end so let's jump in to introduce **Jimmie Mae Hudson**, RHS Ambassador and Queen of the Diamond Divas, Indiana, U.S. She is a retired Health Facility Administrator and throughout her extensive career she longed to be involved in making life wonderful for her residents. Because of her back ground, she has taken a whole new approach to the term "Ambassador." One of the many rewards of the Ambassador program is that it encourages the use of our experience and talents to promote RHS goodwill and, in turn, naturally attract new Members. **Jimmie Mae** started the Diamond Divas chapter with the idea to start groups in several of the nursing homes in her area. After checking with Hatquarters, her first step was to light the spark and she did - in fifteen nursing homes! These groups have the true making of future official chapters. How this works is that **Jimmie Mae** signs up a Vice Queen (the Activities Director of the facility) and an acting future Queen (a resident) as Supporting Members of each facility. She is nurturing them along and they will soon spin off as independent official chapters. She is sharing the joy of hatting with so many women.

You may know that the RHS accepts official nursing home chapters within our ranks but does not require individual Memberships from these women. Of course, if the facility has computer access (as many do now) a chapterette has the option to purchase Membership for the access it gives her. This access will give her the ability to connect with other hatters through our website, night or day. Nursing homes are not to be confused with Active Living Communities where the residents are independent. Active Living Communities start regular RHS chapters and have Supporting Members.

rhs ambassadors

As we travel along the circle, we see that **Jimmie Mae** is associated with the Indiana Queen Council which held a program called Hats of Love led by another Ambassador, **Cheryl Fiesbech** of The Red Garter Girls, Indiana. The idea for the program was to provide hats for **Jimmie Mae's** ladies. Ten hats were to be sponsored at \$20 each. The response was remarkable. These mere 10 hats were not enough for these ladies. They brought jewelry, clothing and more hats – 75 to be exact. The seat of her van was full to the top!

Cheryl is also a photographer so she volunteered to come to the nursing homes to take glamour shots. The sponsor of the hat also receives a picture of the Diamond Diva wearing her hat. Isn't that cool?! 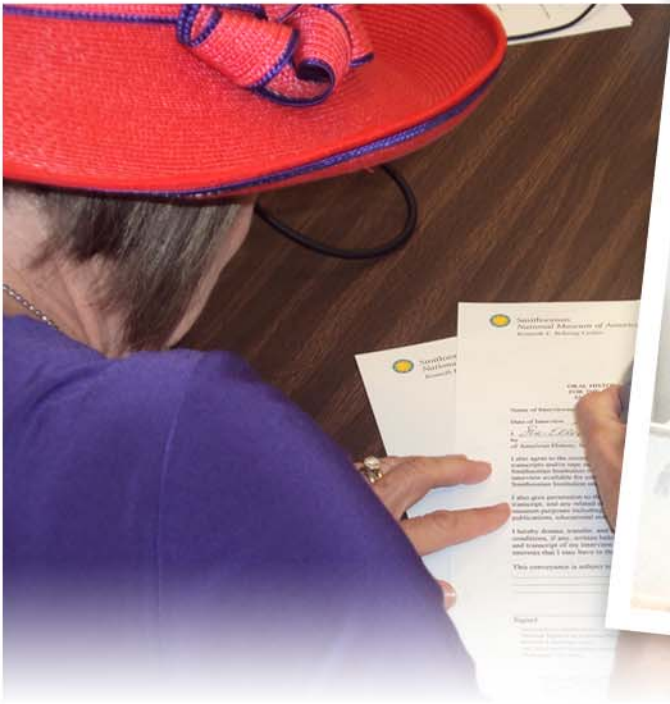
A Day That Will Go Down in History!

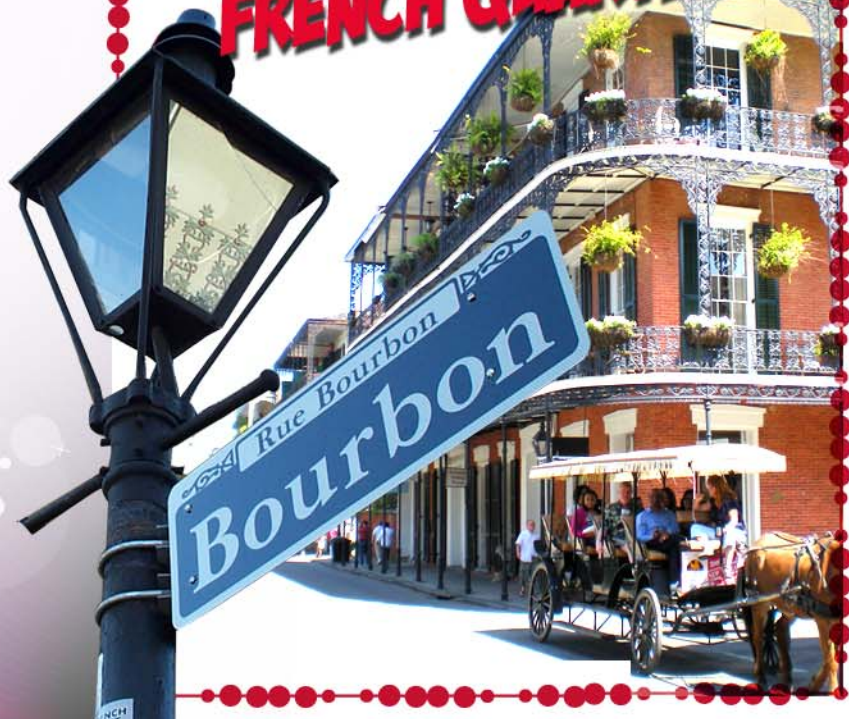

Whether you're preparing for a party or just wanting to try something more adventurous at home, we've got you covered! Here are two lovely recipes, perfect for a quiet tea, a picnic with friends, or a fashionable gathering!



Lavender scones



- 2 cups all purpose flour
- 1 Tablespoon baking powder
- 4 Tablespoons (1/2 stick) sweet, unsalted butter
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons fresh lavender or 1 teaspoon dried culinary lavender, coarsely chopped
- 2/3 cup milk, plus extra for glaze

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Grease & flour a large baking sheet. Sift flour and baking powder together in a large mixing bowl. Mix in the butter until the mixture looks like fine bread crumbs. Stir in the sugar and lavender (save a small amount to sprinkle on top of scones before baking). Add enough milk to make a soft, sticky dough. Turn dough out onto a well floured surface. Cut dough into 1 inch thick rounds with a cookie cutter. Place scones on the prepared baking sheet. Brush the top of each scone with a dash of milk and sprinkle with the reserved lavender and sugar. Bake for 10 to 12 minutes, until golden brown. Makes 12 scones. Serve with rose petal jam and Devon cream.

Pear Tea Sandwiches



- 1 (8-ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- 4 ounces blue cheese, crumbled
- 1/4 plus 1/4 cup chopped walnuts
- 6 plus 6 slices cinnamon raisin bread
- 2 (16-ounce) cans pears, drained and sliced
- 8 ounces thinly sliced honey-baked ham

In a small bowl combine the cream cheese, blue cheese, and 1/4 cup walnuts. Spread the cheese mixture on 6 slices of the bread and then add a layer of pears and ham. Top the sandwiches with the 6 remaining slices of bread. Cut the crust from the bread with a sharp knife and then cut into quarters. Place on a pretty plate and garnish with the remaining 1/4 cup walnuts. Makes 24 tea sandwiches.

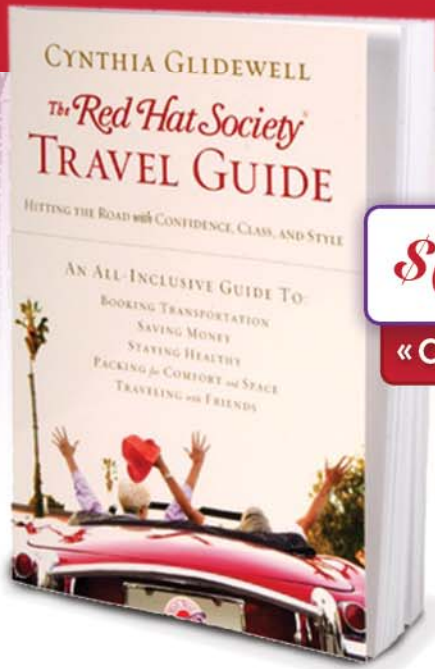
