


WESTERN WOMEN

MAKING SURE YOU GET OUR HMAILS



Do you have trouble receiving all of the RHS communications that you're entitled to? Do you know someone who doesn't receive the Friday Broadcast? Here's what you can do to make sure you stay in the loop!

1. Check your Junk Mail (or Spam) folder.

Sometimes email companies don't recognize our emails correctly, and send them to the junk mail folder! Oh no! If you see a message from the RHS in there, just select the email and click "Not Junk" or "Not Spam" (whichever command your email uses).

2. Add our email addresses to your email address book!

The main addresses we use are memberservices@redhatsociety.com, events@redhatsociety.com, info@redhatsociety.com, and redhatnews@hatquarters.com.

3. Certain types of email have difficulty receiving our messages.

The most common are aol.com, bellsouth.net, and comcast.net (although this list fluctuates from time to time.) If you have one of these emails, consider setting up a secondary account with Gmail or Yahoo. These email providers are free and are able to receive all of our emails!

A REDuation is a Pink Hatter's "rite of passage" which may include a creative ceremony or just a simple swapping of a pink hat for a red one. (We definitely encourage elaborate ceremonies whenever possible!) Now we've made it even easier by creating a digital REDuation kit, which is free for all Supporting Members!





To find the kit, go to www.redhatsociety.com and select "REDuation kit materials" from the Fun Stuff drop-down menu.

You'll see four different items on the page.

The first piece is our exclusive REDuation pledge, which was written by Esteemed Vice Mother Linda Murphy. This pledge has been extremely popular, and it's even used by Hatquarters when staff members REDuate! This pledge has been designed to be printed off and given to attendees so that everyone can recite it together. These print two to a page.

You'll also find an invitation form: it's a cinch to print it off and fill in the names of those you want to invite to the big event. These print two to a page.

Next is a page of Wisdom Notes: these print four to a page, and provide a lovely space where seasoned Red Hatters can write a bit of advice or encouragement to the newly REDuated Hatter! You can print any of these items separately (just click on the item you want: it will open as a printable PDF) or download all of them into a single document. Just another benefit of being a Supporting Member!

At the beginning of the games, one athlete and one judge from the hosting nation take the Olympic Oath on behalf of all participants.

While several forms of the Oath have been used, the current one is "In the name of all the competitors I promise that we shall take part in these Olympic Games, respecting and abiding by the rules which govern them, committing ourselves to a sport without doping and without drugs, in the true spirit of sportsmanship, for the glory of sport and the honor of our teams."

A quote from one of the founders of the modern Olympic Games, Baron de Coubertin, best expresses the Olympic





When we published the Sock Monkey Sisterhood in one of our recent Inspiring Hatters emails, we had no idea it would get such a response! It seems like everyone wants to use this great idea!

You can purchase your own sock monkeys from the Red Hat Society Store or, if you're feeling extra adventurous, make your own! To help you out, here's a simple guide to creating your own sock monkey! (Missed the email? Never fear! You can see ALL Inspiring Hatters emails on the RHS website: just click on Fun Stuff!)

SOCK MONKEYS TO THE RESCUE!



1. Get some cool socks! Monkeys are traditionally made with red-heeled socks, but you can make them with any socks you like! You'll need two socks for each monkey.

2. Turn the socks inside out. Lay one sock flat, heel down: this will be the body and feet of the monkey.



- 3. Draw a line down the center of the sock from the toe to one inch from the heel. Keeping the sock flat, sew up one side of your marked line and back down the other side: leave about a quarter-inch space between the line and your seam.
- 4. Cut along the line: now you have the monkey's legs! Turn the sock right-side out and stuff the sock.
- 5. Decide where you want the monkey's neck to be: using a strong thread or embroidery floss, stitch around the neck with quarter inch stitches. Pull these stitches snugly until the neck is the size you want, then knot the ends.
- 6. Fill the head area with as much stuffing as you want, then gather the tip with large stitches and cinch them closed. Tuck the raw edges inside, and stitch closed.
- 7. Cut the second sock as shown: this will be the arms, tail, and ears.
- 8. Sew up the edges of the arms and tail, turn them right-side out, and stuff them. Attach the tail to the rump and the arms to either side of the
- 9. The heel of the second sock will become the monkey's nose: cut it out and decide where you want the monkey's face to be. Sew the bottom edge of the nose to the monkey's chin, right sides together, so that when you fold the nose up, the outside edge will be a fold (not raw).
- 10. Fold the nose into place and add stuffing, then fold the raw edges in and sew around the rest of the nose.
- 11: Turn the raw edges of the ears to the inside and stitch them closed. Stitch the completed ears to each side of the head.
- 12. Add button eyes and there's your monkey!

Green Tomato Bread

3 eggs

I cup vegetable oil

2 cups sugar

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

2 cups finely chopped green tomatoes

I cup well-drained, crushed pineapple

3 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

I teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

I teaspoon cinnamon



I cup chopped nuts 1/2 cup golden raisins 2 tablespoons sesame seeds



Preheat the oven to 350°. In a large bowl beat the eggs with the oil, sugar, and vanilla until light and fluffy. Stir in the tomatoes and pineapple. Sift the flour, baking soda, salt, baking powder, cinnamon, and mace and add to the mixture. Blend well. Stir in the nuts, raisins, and sesame seeds. Pour into two greased and floured loaf pans. Bake for I hour 15 minutes. Test before removing from oven. Makes 2 loaves.

I cup mayonnaise

1/2 cup dill pickle relish

2 tablespoons minced onion

I tablespoon honey

I 1/2 tablespoons sugar

I teaspoon salt

I/4 teaspoon white pepper

3/4 cup chopped celery

3/4 cup coarsely chopped toasted pecans

1 1/2 pounds chopped cooked chicken (about 4 cups)



Combine the mayonnaise, relish, onion, honey, sugar, salt, and white pepper in a bowl and mix well. Stir in the celery and pecans. Fold in the chicken. Adjust the seasonings to taste. Chill, covered, in the refrigerator. Serve on crusty French bread rolls with potato chips and carrot sticks. Makes 6 to 8 servings.
