## 2017 End of Year Financial Update

Beginning balance was \$611K. Throughout 2017, receipts totaled \$567K and disbursements totaled \$507K with an ending balance of \$670K. The Bremer Bank checking account offers a 0.01% interest rate. The Township has two investment accounts: \$102K in a 0.2% Citizens Alliance Bank Money Market and \$34K in a 5 year 2.0% Bremer Bank CD.

#### Police Contract

After discussion at the 2017 annual meeting, a motion was made and accepted to not sign a 2017 Police Contract unless we were eligible to receive Police Aid Reimbursement. Mid 2017 the MN State Legislature overturned the ruling to not receive the portion of motor vehicle ticket proceed. Late 2017 the Township started receiving motor vehicle ticket revenue; however, this revenue is significantly lower than what we previously received.

## **New Recycling Service: Mumford Sanitation**



The ATHC Douglas Kugler Eco-Site closed. Therefore, the Township Board voted and approved Mumford Sanitation to provide a recycling service to interested residents starting March 8. The contract runs for the next 5 years. Residents will not incur a monthly fee for this service as the Township will be billed directly.

65 gallon carts will be delivered to interested households mid-February. Recycle pick-up is every other Thursday.

Approximately 250 out of 500 households have taken advantage of the new recycling service. If you'd like to participate and haven't signed-up, contact Wayne Hubin in the Township Office at 952.955.2446.

Single-sort recycling includes glass (bottles and jars), plastic (items with a recycling symbol of 1-7), cans (aluminum and tin), paper (newspaper and junk mail), shredded paper (must be in closed bag), books (magazines, catalogs, and telephone books), and corrugated cardboard and box boards. 
#### 2013 and Prior

- 2013: Reconstruction of middle 1 mi of Swede Lake Rd and granite on 3/4 mi of Common St
- 2012: 12 mi of dust coating
- 2011: Reconstruction of 1 mi of Swede Lake Rd and added 2 mi more dust coating
- 2009: Reconstruction of 1 mi of Oxford Ave
- 2008: 12 mi of dust coating

#### 2016

- Fabric and granite on Quaas Ave between 46th St and Newton Ave
- Granite on 2 mi of Newton Ave





- Granite and fabric from west Buck Lake Rd to Oxford Ave
- 1/2 mi west of Swede Lake Rd
- 20 mi of dust coating
- Granite and fabric on 50th St
- Granite on 1 mi of north Oxford Ave
- Fabric and granite on 32nd St and Quaas between 50th St and 46th St
- Granite on 1 mi of Swede Lake Rd

#### Proposed 2018 Projects

- 600-1,000 ft of fabric on 62nd St
- Granite on Quarry, Common St, and 46th St
- Quarry Ave upgrade project near Watertown-Mayer High School

In November 2017, an application was submitted to the Minnesota Department of Transportation and the Local Road Improvement Program for funding to regrade and pave a short portion of Quarry Ave (Township road) adjoining the High School. The plan was developed as this section of Quarry Ave is heavily used during the school year and is problematic from a road maintenance standpoint. A decision is expected in March 2018.

## Right-of-Way Reminders: Plowing, Mowing, and Farming

It is unlawful to perform unauthorized work within a road right-of-way, as well as, to deposit snow, grass clippings, or other debris on or next to a public highway or street per MN Statute 160.2715 and Watertown Township Ordinance. This includes the ditch and right of way along the roadside.

Tilling and planting (including crops, trees, shrubs) within the road right-of-way can cause erosion, roadbed damage, and interfere with drainage. When debris is blown into Township roads, it creates traveling motorist safety and road maintenance concerns.

**Violations are considered misdemeanors and civil penalties apply** if the placement of debris creates a hazard, which extends to the property owner and the person who placed the debris. A typical right-of-way is 66 ft, extending 33 ft from the center of the road.

# Resident Dust Coating and Class-5 Gravel Purchases

To help reduce your liability (damages caused by a third party), install a swing-away mailbox support that meets crash test approval.

Watertown Township will help with the costs by purchasing and installing the mailbox support for you for a **fee of \$75** (half of the Township cost).
