

Saturday 'Visiter' Awards Entry Form

The Saturday *Visiter* Awards (SVAs) are an honor presented by Poe Baltimore, recognizing Edgar Allan Poe's continuing legacy in the arts and literature around the world. The awards celebrate outstanding media, art, performance, and writing that adapt or are inspired by Poe's life and works.

Works of any medium and genre released, printed, distributed, or first performed between **January 1, 2023, and December 31, 2025** (the previous three calendar years) are eligible for consideration. Digital and web-based works also qualify, provided they were first published or posted publicly within this period. **Works created or first released in 2026 are not eligible for this awards cycle.**

Entries may be submitted by an artist, producer, publisher, author, or any member of the creative team. An ensemble member may submit an entry, but valid rights-holder contact information must be provided. Publishers and production companies are welcome to submit entries on a creator's behalf. Self-published and independently produced works are eligible. In all cases, the rights holder must be identified and must grant permission for the work to be considered.

Works may be submitted in any language, but must include English-language subtitles or translations for judging purposes. Creators are limited to one submission per category and are encouraged to select their strongest work.

It is the responsibility of the entrant to confirm that their submission meets all eligibility requirements prior to entering. **Entries deemed ineligible during administrative review or judging will not receive a refund.**

4. Release/publication/copyright date. ONLY works published or released between Jan 1, 2023 thru Dec 31, 2025 are eligible. If your piece was created in 2026 it is NOT eligible this year. *

Provide URL to the complete work. This is how judges will access the piece to review and evaluate it for consideration.

Do not provide social media or promotional links--we need a link to the work itself. Entrants of written works or images are strongly advised to send links to PDF files or formats easily accessible to the judges. **DO NOT send URL that requires password to enter as this may impede the judges' access.** Do not send a link that requires even a \$0 purchase.

This link is for judges only and will not be shared with the public for any reason. At this time, works may only be submitted electronically for consideration. Should you feel your piece is best represented in physical format, please indicate so in your description of the work. In such cases, URL is still required.

6. Description or synopsis of the work, including medium and/or genre. Please also note size, dimensions, duration or any site-specific or process details that might not be readily apparent to the judges upon viewing your link. Indicate if an artificial intelligence program, a.k.a. AI, was used in whole or in part when creating the work. (Note that your entry should be an artistic work rather than critical analysis or academic treatise.) *

7. Was an artificial intelligence program (a.k.a. AI) used to create any part of the entry? You will NOT be penalized for this answer, however the entry will be disqualified if it is later identified as an AI generated work (in whole or part) and the artist did not disclose this in the process details. *
