

Since 1994, SIREN/ Eaton Shelter has been a beacon of hope to those experiencing domestic violence and homelessness in our community.

- On any given day, we have up to 30 houses occupied throughout Eaton County and beyond.
- We operate an Emergency Domestic Violence Shelter, known as Opportunity House, and provide motel accommodations when our shelters are full.
- Year-to-date, we have served 923 individuals, including 496 children:

Provided 27,820 shelter nights

Served 20,190 meals

Distributed clothing and household items

Offered Christmas gifts and Easter baskets

Provided school supplies

Answered 805 crisis calls

Unfortunately, we had to turn away **389 households** due to lack of available housing and funding.

Since our founding in the 1990s, we have uniquely combined domestic violence and housing services, offering not only emergency shelter but also safe housing opportunities that lead to permanent solutions. Here are just a few life-changing success stories made possible by your generosity:

- **A Family's Journey to Stability:** This family entered our services as winter approached, initially being placed in a hotel. Through placement in our emergency shelter and case management services, they established a healthy budget, secured long-term employment, and embarked on their housing search. Soon after, they transitioned to our Rapid Rehousing program and signed a lease on a rental of their choosing.
- Overcoming Homelessness: Another family came to us during the coldest winter months after experiencing street homelessness. With the support of our case management team, they navigated barriers to employment and daycare, ultimately moving from emergency shelter into our Transitional Housing Program. There, they received in-depth assistance allowing them to secure a rental of their own.

- From Car Homelessness to a Permanent Home: A household that was car homeless found refuge in our emergency shelter. With our support, they obtained remote employment, pursued online education, and successfully applied for benefits. They transitioned to our Transitional Housing Program and ultimately secured a permanent rental.
- Fleeing Danger and Finding Safety: Another family sought our services after fleeing a dangerous situation where they were quickly placed in our Emergency Shelter. They faced challenges finding safe housing that accommodated their service animals. Our case management team worked closely with them to develop a safety plan, navigate the Social Security system, and ultimately find a safe rental that met their needs.
- Achieving Financial Independence: One family came to us after experiencing literal homelessness. With our support, the head of the household gained employment and developed a budget, enabling them to move into a rental without additional subsidy.

These stories are just a glimpse into the transformative impact of your support. As we look ahead to the coming year, we invite you to continue this journey with us. Your donations, alongside federal and state grants, allow us to provide vital services that change lives.
