**All quilts in sections 1 and 2 MUST BE A minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter to go on to the District Competition to be judged. All quilts must be solely made and hand quilted by the exhibitor unless otherwise specified.**

1. Quilt – pieced, 324" measured on perimeter or larger	25	20	10
2. Quilt – appliquéd, 324" measured on perimeter or larger	25	20	10
3. Quilt – any size	25	20	10
4. Lap Quilt – made using only 3 fabrics of 1 yard each, for the Top, extra fabrics can be used for the binding and backing	20	15	10

8. <b>NEW - Quilt Block, 12.5" square, unfinished</b>	15	12	10

### Quilts (machine quilted) – Class 58

**All quilts in Sections 1 and 2 MUST be a minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter. Note: the quilt can be square, rectangle etc. Quilts must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor to qualify to go on.**

1. Quilt pieced, total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches.	25	20	10
2. Quilt appliquéd, total perimeter measurements to be a minimum of 324 inches	25	20	10
3. Quilt – pieced or appliquéd, any size	25	20	10

## Quilts - Commercially Quilted - Class 59

More and more quilts are being sent out to be quilted. Commercial quilting will be allowed in this class. **The exhibitor must have created the top and binding but the actual quilting is done by someone other than the exhibitor. Exhibitor must provide the name of quilter on the exhibitor tag.**
