If you are not progressing forward, practice with your Lead Trainer (without the dog). Then you can practice with the dog while your trainer holds the leash for you. Wait By the end of the Coaching Sessions with your trainers, you should be able to mark and reward these behaviors appropriately and begin putting these behaviors on cue.
