

# Palencia Pirates PTO Meeting October 8, 2021

#### **Agenda**

- School update Mrs. Goodrich
  - o Next week is the Department of Education Full Time Equivalent (FTE) survey week. This is when a snapshot is taken of our student enrollment and attendance over a course of 11 days. It is beneficial for students to be in class on these days and for bus riders to ride the bus on these days so that our numbers are accurate for funding purposes.
  - o Gifted Screening will be taking place on October 11 for 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students. If a student screens accordingly, a full Gifted Assessment will then be scheduled. If you are new to the district and do not have a 2<sup>nd</sup> grader or feel as though your child should be screened please contact Ms. Ellis, our school counselor.

  - o October 18 is a Teacher Planning Day, No School.

#### General PTO Update

- o Financials, Treasurer Amy Gramatges
  - The last set of classroom cubbies were purchased with proceeds from last year's fundraising efforts have been installed.
  - Fundraising efforts this year will be used to create new outdoor space for the children and teachers.
  - The PTO will be distributing back over \$10,000 directly to the classrooms from proceeds from Boosterthon. Each classroom who met their goal will receive 5% and each grade level that met their goal will receive 5%. All grades met their goal, so all teachers will receive funds.
  - Each classroom was also given \$100 for teacher classroom needs.

- o Outdoor Update, Jennifer Lee
  - The projected cost for the Outdoor Project is \$300-500,000. This would encompass the open field and the Pirate Cove (the area in the front of the school). Currently we are speaking with a Landscape Architecture Firm in Jacksonville. We will be meeting for a wall mapping sessions to discuss options.

- Phase 1 of the project will focus on the back field. Half of the field will be dedicated PE space and the other half for recreational play.
- Phase 2 will focus on the Pirate Cove and include more outdoor learning space.
- We have already ordered new activities for the children to utilize in the current space including Gaga Ball sets, a large Connect 4 game, and a large Jenga game.
