FELLOW RIVERWOODS SUBDIVISION NEIGHBORS REMINDERS

Fall is just around the corner and the Board wants to share with you some maintenance tips.

It's a good time to make sure:

- * All your windows and doors are caulked.
- * Check your roof to make sure there are no missing shingles.
- It's time to prepare to shut the water off to your outside faucets and drain your garden hoses.
- * Take a walk around your house to inspect your gutters, downspouts and roof to make sure there is no damage.
- * Make sure your downspouts are clean.
- * This is a good time to prune your trees. As a reminder, your trees need a 7' clearance from the street.
- * Inspect your driveway for cracks.
- Get ready to turn-off your sprinkler systems for the season.
- Check the trees at your curb to see if they need to be replaced.
- * Weed around your landscaping and your driveway, and pull suckers from around your street trees.

DID YOU KNOW A Canton Fun Fact!



Canton Historical Society Museum: In 1977, the Plymouth-Canton School District donated the structure for use as a museum, and it later opened as a museum for the Canton Historical Society. The school started in 1840 as a one-room log cabin schoolhouse. It burned down in 1883 and was rebuilt in 1884 with bricks. It ceased operating as a grammar school in 1954, but continued as a school for kindergarten classes until 1961 and opened as a museum in 1982. The building stands on its original location at the corner of Canton Center and Heritage Park Dr. and displays pictures of Canton's history. RICE WITH CHICKEN & ASPARAGUS

Ingredients:

- 1 bunch asparagus
- 2 Tbsp. avocado oil
- 1/2 yellow onion, chopped
- 1 cup jasmine rice
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- 1 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 tsp. onion powder
- 2 cups chicken stock
- 1 lemon, juiced
- 2 cups shredded cooked chicken

Directions:

- Cut asparagus into 1-in. pieces and set aside.
- In a large skillet, heat oil over medium heat.
- Add onion and cook for 3-4 minutes.
- Add rice and spices and cook for 1 minute, keep stirring.
- Stir in stock and lemon juice. Bring to boil and cover. Reduce heat to low and simmer for 8 minutes.
- Stir rice mixture and add asparagus.
- Cook an additional 5-7 minutes or until asparagus is tender.
- Stir in shredded chicken and heat until warmed through.
- Add desired garnishes (parmesan cheese, fresh parsley, chopped arugula) and serve warm. Enjoy!

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE REMINDERS

As you may have read in past newsletters and during our meetings, the Board intends to enforce all Covenants and Restrictions and all fines. We will be paying special attention to Article VI Section 14, which include the following:

- Failure to maintain landscaping, including retaining walls and edging, out of control weeds in lawns, driveways, flower beds and shrubs, around mailboxes, etc.
- Failure to remove grass clippings, leaves or other debris from the street.
- \Diamond Failure to maintain home exterior.
- Missing or dead street trees and trees not trimmed 7 feet from the road; this is also a Canton ordinance.
- Grass higher than 5 inches in height; this is also a Canton ordinance.
