





Kids' Ministry


"Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old, he will not depart from it."

Summer ministry is always full of energy and joy. This year, God brought many new children to our program, filling our days with laughter and learning.

Through Bible lessons, music, and fun activities, the children grew closer to Jesus. Our volunteers gave their time and love, making the whole program possible. Over 60 kids have joined the VBS program and over 40 volunteers have helped to make this event successful.

At the end of the year, our Community Christmas event welcomed about 300 people, including 115 children. We worked together with YWAM's DTS team and volunteers from many churches and schools, showing the power of unity in Christ.

More than 160 children received Christmas gifts donated by *Box of Hope* and *ICS*, and over 300 people heard the message of the gospel.

Even small acts like a kind word or prayer can plant seeds of faith that grow. God has also shown me the power of community, bringing parents, volunteers, and supporters together to serve. Though there were challenges, God always provided and proved His faithfulness. Vision

- Equip youths with life skills through mentorship and structured programs.

- Create a safe, nurturing environment for youths transitioning from the Kids Club into Youth Ministry

With the support of skilled volunteers, we began offering music lessons. Last year, we provided piano and violin classes for our kids, and this year we are excited to continue with the addition of ballet classes as well.

Goals for 2026

Looking ahead to 2026, the Youth Ministry is focused on deepening discipleship and empowering the next generation of leaders. One key initiative is the idea of a ‘Worship Leading Program’, designed to nurture young talents in music and media. Through regular worship leading opportunities, youths will be empowered to use their musical gifts for worship and ministry. Another focus is the development of a ‘Peer Mentoring and Discipleship Track’, where senior youths will be trained to mentor younger peers through Bible study, prayer, and life-sharing, fostering spiritual growth and leadership from within.

We thank God for His faithfulness and the lives that have been transformed through the Youth Ministry in 2025. Every goal reached, every story shared, and every step forward is a testimony of His grace and provision. 

Abiding in Him: How Mini-DTS Reshaped My Life: Shankar

My name is Shankar Gurung. I am 42 years old and from Nepal. Before my Discipleship Training School (DTS), I lived for a year at Operation Dawn, a gospel-based rehabilitation center. There, I built a strong spiritual foundation. However, after leaving, I felt the pressures of the world pulling me away from that life, and I could feel myself slowly drifting. In His faithfulness, God knew I needed guidance. He used the Mini DTS as a clear call to return and abide in Him. The program reshaped me according to His will and taught me what it truly means to be a disciple of Christ. When God calls, He provides. I lacked the funds to join, but God moved the heart of Donors to cover my expenses—a blessing for which I am eternally grateful. I can feel my spiritual growth daily. I am profoundly thankful to God, His angels, and His people who supported me during this transformative journey.

This inner renewal has already borne fruit, as my changed attitude recently sparked my aunt's interest in Jesus—a direct answer to prayer and a testament to God working through me. I am grateful for this journey from curiosity to calling, and I give all glory to God for making me a new creation and launching me as His disciple.

Financial Wellbeing Workshop for Young Adults 2025

The Financial Wellbeing Workshop held in October 2025, was a big success. It was funded by the SIE Fund and Oxfam Hong Kong, and led by volunteer Ms. Theros Wong. The workshop helped young adults learn important money skills like budgeting, setting goals, and investing.

Surveys before and after the workshop showed great results: participants' knowledge grew by 84%, and their confidence increased by 76%. The "Invest 101" session was especially helpful, filling a big gap in financial knowledge. People left with practical tools, such as how to set SMART goals and why emergency funds are important.

Feedback from participants was very positive. Many called the workshop a "game-changer" that changed how they think about money. They praised the teaching for being clear and relevant.

Enjila Pun says : The Financial Wellbeing Workshop truly changed my life. I started with no knowledge, but the teacher explained everything clearly and made it easy to understand. I didn't just learn facts—I gained a new way of thinking about money and the confidence to plan for a safe financial future. Thank you, ICM, for this amazing experience!

Women's Retreat

The Bible says, "One can chase a thousand, but two can put ten thousand to flight" (**Deuteronomy 32:30**). We often help each other in ministry whenever we can.

On October 1st, 2025, A holiday when many mothers were free, we held a special event with the collaboration with MOMS IN PRAYER. We saw God's faithfulness when we gave away a gold-plated Nepali Bible as a lucky draw. The winner, holding ticket #26, was a mother who had been searching for that exact Bible for months. This moment strengthened her faith and led her to be more involved with ICM. Around 35 ladies from the community joined the event.

I also remember last November when Aunty Caroline, our Family Minister, had to leave suddenly. She asked me to teach a Christian Nepali cultural dance to mothers for the December performances and Women's Christmas celebration. At first, the mothers were shy and busy with their daily lives. But once they realized the dance was a form of worship, their attitude changed. They practiced with dedication, and on December 4th, they performed beautifully—honoring God with every step and beat.

Sewing Ministry

I often say that my faith journey began in the ICM Sewing class, where the staff taught and guided me. Now I help run the classes, and I feel blessed to be part of this family. My job is to invite women from our community, encourage them to join, bring them together, sew with them, and teach them the projects I've learned. I especially focus on helping newcomers and making sure they feel safe and welcome.

In our community, we have many Nepali sisters, as well as Filipinos, Indonesians, Indians, and Pakistanis. Many are housewives, domestic helpers, or single mothers facing challenges. Some come searching for support and help, while others simply love sewing.

Through these classes, we not only teach sewing skills but also share the good news of Jesus. The purpose of this ministry is to help women find salvation, freedom from life's burdens, and true peace and joy in Christ.

This year, a total of 16 ladies are learning sewing.

To ensure that their learning is not disturbed by their children, our staff also takes care of the children in another room.

Cantonese Lessons

In 2025, two seasons of Cantonese classes were conducted. These courses provided valuable language learning opportunities for many brothers and sisters in the community. In addition to language courses, teachers integrated the gospel into the lessons by using the Bible as a literature text. This approach allowed participants to grow both in language skills and in faith.

Future Goals

- Raise awareness about the ICM sewing classes in our community
- Empower more people to learn sewing and share the skill with others
- Share God's love, peace, and salvation with them, their families, and friends

Areas of Improvement

We are working hard to keep better track of our schedules, and progress is being made. Since it can be difficult for people to join sewing classes for a whole year, we plan to divide the program into two 6 month seasons.

We also hope to add knitting and crochet sessions, with help from others who have these skills. We believe these plans will succeed only with the guidance of our Almighty God. As **Proverbs 3:5-6** reminds us: *“Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight.”*

Family Ministry

“There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven: a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot.” (Ecclesiastes 3:1)

I praise God and thank Him for reminding me of the prayer of our Lord Jesus in **John 17:22**—that He has given us the opportunity to share His holiness and His glory. I would like to testify to the goodness of the Lord that we have witnessed in the land of the living.

During a visit to friends in the UK, I saw how they accepted Jesus and were baptized through our ministry at ICM. Later, her father also believed in the Lord and was baptized. Last year, God called him home to eternity. Though he passed away, he is now with his Heavenly Father, and this brought comfort to his family.

A few years ago, while in India, I shared the gospel with a neighbor who was a strong Hindu. Some of his children, now in Hong Kong, have believed in Jesus though not yet baptized. Their father, however, accepted the Lord and was baptized last year. Only a few months later, God took him to his eternal home, just as promised in **John 14:3**. Both of these men were in their 90s, showing God’s patience and faithfulness in answering the prayers of their families. This two stories shows God’s promises that in His due time he will do beyond our imagination and teaches us to be patience and perseverance.

This year was also refreshing for our sisters who attended the Moms In Prayer (MIP) retreat, followed by training sessions at

International Baptist Church and St. Andrew’s Church. They grew deeper in the Lord and were grateful for the sponsorship provided by sisters from different churches.

As we sow seeds of faith, God will surely give us opportunities to rejoice when the harvest comes—in His time. While accompanying people for translation at hospitals or other places, I pray with them and share the gospel, because our hope is only in Jesus. Sometimes God even brings back people we ministered to long ago. For example, Teju and Mim Bains returned to ICM after 23 years. We used to pray and fellowship with them at Chung King Mansion, and now we have connected them with a Nepali church for continued fellowship. Many children and families we have helped are returning with spiritual hunger, seeking fellowship once again. The following stories are the living testimonies that assure us that God will never leave us nor forsake us.

Testimony – Swetcha Tamang

Jaimashi everyone,

I come from a non-Christian family, but when I was young, my sister, aunt, and I started going to church. Through Aunt Caroline, we were introduced to ICM. I joined the kids’ club every Saturday, Vacation Bible School (VBS) every summer, church every Sunday, and even went to ICM after school to do homework. Afterward, we would spend time with the aunts and uncles there. ICM felt like a

second home because our parents worked late nights, and we were always welcomed.

It was at ICM that I began to know the Lord. I learned how to pray and build my relationship with Him. I had opportunities to help at the mission fair workshops and volunteer at VBS. As I grew older, I wanted to be closer to God, so I joined mini-DTS and even went on a mission trip. ICM inspired me to serve the Lord.

However, I became busy with school and later returned to my home country for further studies. During that time, I stopped going to church and ICM. After finishing my studies, I came back to Hong Kong, but work consumed me, and I drifted away from God, the church, and ICM.

Yet, I felt a longing in my heart—I was missing something. While talking with a friend about my childhood at ICM, she shared that her mother also used to bring her there. That conversation reminded us both of Aunt Caroline, and we decided to reconnect with her and start going to church again. I wanted to grow closer to God, seek forgiveness, and find peace in Him.

Now, as I volunteer at VBS, I want to give back what I have learned and received.




