- Following the floods, the government initiated the *demolition of structures built on riparian lands.*

- We believe these demolitions were inhumane, and the impact has been significant.
- Our teenagers are calling upon God for mercy on our beautiful country, Kenya, as per 1 Chronicles 7:14.
