The easels allow the Centre's respite care artists easier access to their work and can be used while seated.


The easels were built by Shed West's Keith Foy and Ken Martin and handed over by Chairman Graeme Curnow.

Workshop tips

The basic wood working and carpentry sessions have provided members with some interesting and useful ideas.

To keep chisels razor-sharp, glue a piece of leather with the rough side upwards to a block of wood (70mm wide by 150 mm long). Apply some burnishing compound and each time you use the chisel just rub the bevelled side of the chisel over the burnishing block. This will keep your chisels razor sharp (Charles Smith).

Jewellery making

At a recent meeting member Don Atkinson demonstrated the techniques used in making silver jewellery learnt from a long career in the industry. Don showed the group how to make a silver crocodile charm using cuttlefish as a mould. He also showed a wonderful array of specialist tools and a charm bracelet which he had made. Don shared many stories and ideas about jewellery and the metals used in the industry.
