

<u>Keynote Speaker: Shane Feldman</u>

Friday 2:00 - 3:00 pm (.1 CEUs)

Shane Feldman will talk about the key principles that nurture an environment that encourages partnerships and consistently seeks to define shared values. These values lay the foundation for transformative community-wide change. He will then describe, and provide examples of communities that build a culture of collaboration through open dialogue, platforms for engagement, and breaking down silos that hinder communication and information sharing.

Shane Feldman's Biography

Shane Feldman is the CEO of Innivee Strategies an organizational and leadership development company. He has over 20 years of exceptional and invigorating leadership that has impacted many national and local organizations along with their stakeholders. As an executive, he aligned associations to the expectations of their boards and members. These achievements came through systemic changes to policies, processes, and practices that resulted in significant increases in visibility, efficiency, revenues, accountability, and influence.

Shane was the Chief Operating Officer at the National Association of the Deaf, Executive Director at the Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf, and a Director at the Communication Service for the Deaf. He was President of the Discovering Deaf Worlds Board and numerous other boards and organizations. His leadership has spearheaded issues in the Deaf and hard of hearing community ranging from human services, international development, employment, ASL interpreters, captioning, and leadership development.

Shane received his Bachelor's degree in Professional and Technical Communications from the Rochester Institute of Technology, a Master's in Management, and a Certificate in Nonprofit Financial Management from the University of Maryland University College is a Certified Association Executive and was selected to the Diversity Executive Leadership Program in the American Society of Association Executives. He is also a professional executive coach.
