A Time to Be Born

On Wednesday, June 13, 1962 in Shelby, North Carolina, God granted a healthy baby boy to the late Carl Allison and Lizzie Dawkins Eaves. Since a very young age, Franklin was taught the Word of God at Hopewell Baptist Church in Shelby. He matriculated through the educational system and became a 1980 graduate of Crest Senior High School.

A Time of War, and a Time of Peace

He was dedicated to serving his country by joining the United States Army. Elder Eaves served in Germany from 1983-1986 as a Medical Specialist and received an honorable discharge.

A Time to Rend, and a Time to Sow

As an experienced Taekwondo six-degree black belt, Franklin taught combat techniques as a Martial Arts Instructor. Franklin attended the Atlanta College of Medical and Dental Careers, American University, Dekalb College, and The Atlanta Area School for The Deaf.

A Time to Love

Franklin loved to serve as a member of New Mercies Christian Church in Lilburn, Georgia under the leadership of Pastor Jesse Curney, III. Elder Franklin was a faithful and dedicated Servant, Elder, and Church Interpreter for the deaf ministry. He was an Instructor for Project Destiny in Lithonia, Georgia.

A Time to Keep Silent and a Time to Speak

Interpreter Eaves was very active in the Deaf Community. He served as a Sign Language Interpreter and travelled worldwide interpreting for many events, corporations, organizations, including the United States White House. He served as scholarship committee chairperson of The National Alliance of Black Interpreters (NAOBI) of Atlanta, Georgia. As a strong ally for the Deaf community and staple for NAOBI-ATLANTA, he will be greatly missed. His contributions to our organization and the profession of sign language interpreting will never be forgotten. Elder Eaves is also a founding member of United We Sign, a coalition of East Coast Church Interpreters. He championed the work of The International Institute of Deaf Services, Inc., a source for faith-based interpreters across the country, offering training and resources for Deaf leadership and Deaf empowerment. Elder Eaves is the founder of Prophetic Hands Deaf Ministry at New Mercies. He's provided interpreting services for the National Baptist Church Convention, Manpower Conference, Black Voters Matter, and The National Action Network.

A Time to Die

He is preceded in death by his parents and five siblings, Arthur Eaves, Jr., Dorothy Eaves Lowe, Martha Eaves Winston, Belvin G. Eaves, and Patsy Eaves Hopper. Mr. Franklin C. Eaves heard the clarion call and departed this life on Wednesday, June 14, 2023 at Emory Decatur Hospital in Decatur, Georgia.






