

# Home Energy Assistance Program

The 2025-2026 Regular HEAP benefit opened December 1, 2025. If you are eligible, you may receive one regular HEAP benefit per program year and could also be eligible for Emergency HEAP benefits if you are in danger of running out of fuel or having our utility service shut off. Eligibility and benefits are based on income, household size, the primary heating source, and the presences of a household member who are under 6, age 60 or older, or permanently disabled. ## Project Warmth

Project Warmth is Long Island's only non-governmental, island -wide emergency fuel fund. This program provides a one-time grant for fuel and/or fuel-related electricity. Payments are made directly to oil and utility companies on behalf of eligible residents facing heating emergencies. To receive funds from Project Warmth, you must meet the following criteria:

- Be a resident of Nassau or Suffolk Counties, or the Rockaways
- Show financial need, provide an acceptable explanation for the unpaid energy bills
- Applicants must have first exhausted of been denied emergency HEAP assistance and have not topped off oil tank in any previous year.

Get heat assistance through Project Warmth for yourself or a loved one.
