



WRAPPING THINGS UP



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

This autumn has had more than a fair share of lingering warm days. I'm not complaining, it was a delightful season. The short sleeve shirts were regularly in use most days. That helped to balance things out from the very cold spring that we had. But now the cooler days of fall are finally upon us. Last week the Garden Club, along with a few volunteers, cleaned up the garden and prepared it for its winter rest. I finally put away the patio table and chairs at the house. I've trimmed back the enormous vine that grows over the trellis on the path to my front door. All the signs of summer are well behind us and we are immersed in fall.

August 31 was the end of our fiscal year. We are working on a year-end financial report which we will publish in the bulletin as well as on the website. I was relieved when we hit the final total button; we came out with a slight surplus of about \$6,000. This was the tightest year we have had since I have been pastor. This was an extraordinary year in terms of our finances. We not only had several major capital improvement projects we had to tackle, we also had to contribute to the settlement fund that was part of the Diocesan bankruptcy. In spite of enormous hurdles, your generosity enabled us to do all that we had to do. Thank you for your ongoing support. Not every parish is able to operate free from the cloud of debt and deficits. We are very blessed by the generosity of this community.

This year the liturgical calendar makes a few detours in the month of November. Next Sunday, November 2, is All Souls' Day. All the Masses on the weekend will be for our deceased loved ones. Traditionally, we have one special Mass on All Souls' Day in which we announce by name all those who have been buried from Holy Cross in the previous year. That special Mass, which is held in the evening, also includes a candlelight procession. We will not be able to do that this year at all of the Masses throughout the day, but the focus remains on our departed family, friends, and fellow parishioners. All Souls' Day is one of the days in the Church year that naturally works and makes a connection to the heart of all. We have all shared in the loss of someone dear to us. There is great comfort and strength that comes about when we pray for those who have died.

The following weekend, all the Masses are for the Feast of the Dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran in Rome. This fourth century church is considered the Mother Church of all churches in Rome. (St Peter's Basilica was not built until the 16th century.) It is the home of the Bishop of Rome. While it may feel unusual for us to be celebrating a church that is half a world away, it is a day in which we are reminded that we are part of a universal Church. We return to the regular celebration of Ordinary Time Masses on November 16.

Continue to enjoy the days of autumn.



WORKS (Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2025")

It's amusing to see the Pharisee present God with his moral resume, as if God is not aware already of our every action and thought. Worse than his arrogance, however, is the Pharisee's contempt for his brother in faith, the tax collector. How often do we sit at Mass and view members of our faith family with judgment or even scorn? Better for us to take the measure of our sinfulness and avoid a preoccupation with anyone else's.

as part of the Holy Cross Prayer Blanket Ministry




FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 14, 2025 from 7:00PM - 9:00PM




