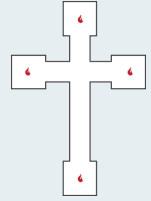

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



For those who attended the concert last Sunday on the lawn of my house, I think you would agree, it was quite a night. The weather could not have been better. It was a comfy-sized crowd that came out. The music was a variety of fun, relaxing, and life-giving tunes. It was a peaceful and joyful evening. Even the mosquitos cooperated by not showing up. Many thanks to Brian Reich who led the evening along with the other musicians and singers. I appreciate that he makes it look easy, but there is a lot of energy and work that goes into planning an event like this. When the evening was over there was a spontaneous wave of helping hands that cleaned everything up in a matter of minutes. It was a great Holy Cross night.

Making time for something holy or fun or memorable can be a great blessing and a source of life. Everyone has busy lives and things to worry about. Taking the effort to step outside the usual routine can reap abundant benefits. It's not a matter of having to create a lavish setting or spending lots of money. God often creates a space for great things to happen, such as a backyard with blue skies above and the perfect temperature. Anything that we can do to help us appreciate life helps to keep us focused. It's not as though it magically takes away all the woes of our lives. I have also revised and increased the availability of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. A parishioner raised a question about our handicap accessibility which we are pursuing. More to come on this. I'm trying to organize what I would like to call the "Family Life Committee." We offer events like "Trunk or Treat" and the Winter Carnival to our families. I'm looking for greater involvement in planning and running activities like this for our families. We have some parents who are committed to these events, but there is an abundance of work that I am hoping will be shared by even more parishioners. More to come on this as well. I have not forgotten the theme of "Called to Compassion." We already had several activities involving that theme earlier in the year. The theme can have wide reach in touching many of the issues that surround us in life. I hope to do more with it between now and Christmas.

Summer is hitting the half-way point. In my book, it has been unfolding at a good pace. But as usual, the list of things I hoped to accomplish is still a bit longer than things I actually got done. But, fear not, there is still time to get on track and make the most of these special days of the year. Enjoy.

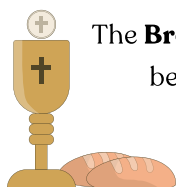

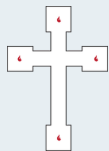

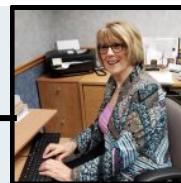

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2026")

If given the chance that Solomon had, what would you have asked God for immediately, without thinking? What would you ask for with some time to reflect?
