

HAPPY TO BE ORDINARY

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



The Christmas season is now behind us and we are once again in Ordinary Time, at least for a few weeks. Ash Wednesday will come soon enough. It was a wondrous and uplifting season here at our parish. Our overall attendance was up a bit from last year. We broke the 2,000 mark in total attendance with the Christmas Eve Mass at 4:00 being the most crowded. The Worship Area always looks so beautifully decorated. I am grateful to all the helping hands that allowed our celebration of Christmas to be a joyful and hopeful celebration for all. I am also grateful for all the Christmas goodies and gifts that Santa's helpers left behind. The festivities and decorations of the season are always joyful, but beyond that, it is spiritually nourishing to be reminded that our God has come and dwells among us. I pray your Christmas was a holy one.

The most interesting gift Santa brought me was a Himalayan salt block. At first, I had no clue what it was. It is about an inch and a half thick and about the size of a cutting board. It is slowly heated on the stove top, and then you cook directly on the salt block. It is supposed to add a unique flavor to the recipe. I have been told it is particularly effective when cooking fish. I have yet to give it a try, but I am looking forward to a new cooking experience.

Although attendance was higher, our total Christmas collection was a couple of thousand dollars less than last year. However, regular weekly donations have remained strong. Since the financial report was given in June, there has been a modest increase in overall collections. Additional parishioners signed up for the monthly ACH donations (electronic giving), which helps us tremendously. For example, we had two snowfalls this year that coincided with weekends. Understandably, collections are lower those weekends. The lost income is not gained back the following weekend. Having a regular stream of income through ACH donations minimizes the impact of inclement weekends. Those wintery days make our Worship Area even more picturesque. But the downside to this is we have already spent more on snow removal and sanding this year than we had the past two years. I pray all the fury of this winter has already passed. Thank you to all who regularly and generously support our work and ministry.

The Holy Father officially ended the Jubilee Year on January 6, which was the Feast of the Epiphany. The theme that the universal Church embraced was Pilgrims of Hope. In different ways we tried weaving that theme into our prayer here at Holy Cross, and I hope it was beneficial to your own spiritual journey. Next weekend we will be introducing a theme that we will use more locally here at our parish. The theme is "Called to Compassion/Changing Our World with God's Love." This idea came about from the Religious Education Congress that many of the staff and parishioners attended last February. In different ways we hope to build on that invitation. A deeper commitment to seek compassion can bring about change in our hearts, our community, and beyond. I pray this will be a fruitful endeavor for us. Indeed, there will be more to come on this.

A few last-minute seats have become available for the Ireland trip which is April 18-27. If anyone is interested, let me know and I will get you the necessary information.

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2026")

The readings this week remind us of how our baptism calls us to practice our faith through acts of charity. St. John the Baptist testifies that Jesus is the Son of God who baptizes us with the Holy Spirit. St. Paul tells us we are "sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be holy" (1 Cor 1:2). Do you know how to answer this call to sanctification? Pope Francis teaches, "This holiness to which the Lord calls you will grow through small gestures" (*Gaudete et exsultate*, 16). Try to practice small gestures of charity this week:

Call or visit someone whom you know is lonely.

Practice attentive driving, give the right of way to other drivers on the road, and look out for the safety of pedestrians.

Bring a donation of food to a food bank or volunteer in a soup kitchen.



ANOINTING OF THE SICK

LITURGY BYTES *by Michele Hall*



A Sacrament that is often forgotten about or misunderstood is the Anointing of the Sick. It is also one of the Sacraments of Healing, the other being Reconciliation. This Sacrament has an interesting history, which has led to a great deal of misunderstanding. Some folks refer to it as Last Rites, as for many years it was known as that. Going back, it was called Extreme Unction and was celebrated when a person was close to or already dead. Our understanding today is quite different. Notice the change of name – Anointing of the Sick.

Actually, there is no such thing as the Last Rites in the Church today with the exception of Viaticum which refers to the reception of Holy Communion for the last time. The word Viaticum means "for the journey." The person is receiving the Eucharist to help them on their way to heaven. Fortunately today, even if someone is not able to go to Mass, we have Eucharistic Ministers who visit the homebound and bring Holy Communion to them weekly.

You might ask, who can and when can we receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick? Here are some examples: one going into the hospital; one going for surgery, one who has a serious illness (mental, emotional, or physical); one who is of advanced age; one who has a recurrence of an illness or a setback; and, of course, anyone with a terminal illness. It is best not to wait but to take advantage of this beautiful Sacrament of healing. This Sacrament is celebrated with the Oil of the Sick, which is blessed by the Bishop each year at the Chrism Mass. The minister of this Sacrament is only a Bishop or a Priest. The reason for this restriction is the person being anointed is also forgiven of their sins, which can only be done by a Bishop or Priest. The person is anointed on their head and hands with this final prayer: "May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up." Amen.

May you have a blessed, healthy, and happy week ahead!
