

### Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

I'm sharpening up my pencils and cracking open a new marble notebook, as I will be heading back to school for a week. (If I got with the times, I should actually be charging my laptop and preparing to do a vlog.) This week I will be attending a preaching workshop for priests being held at Catholic University in Washington D.C. This seminar is the first offering of the newly formed *Fulton J. Sheen Excellence in Preaching Initiative*. Some of the presentations are theological and pastoral in nature. And some of the presentations will be given by the Drama and Theater faculty which will focus more on technique and delivery. This should be interesting. I heard about this opportunity through the Priest Personnel Director for the Diocese. This summer program is being underwritten by the Lily Foundation. The only cost to participants is transportation to and from Washington. It was an amazing offer that I could not pass up. I will be leaving after the 8:00 Mass and will return on Friday evening.

I am looking forward to this opportunity. I attended a more in-depth preaching workshop about 25 years ago in Chicago. That program took place for several weeks over the course of two summers. I always struggled as a student throughout my educational career. There is an element of challenge in doing something like this, but there is also something exciting about it. As far as I know there are only two other priests from our Diocese attending, so I will be meeting priests from around the country. I'm looking forward to the experience. I will try to behave and not get sent to detention. Hopefully there will be some free time that I will be able to do some fun things around the city.

If anyone likes the challenge of keeping weeds out of flower beds, boy, do we have opportunities for you. There are many corners of the parish property that could use some tender loving care. If you would like to help out keeping our grounds looking neat and tidy, please give Karina, our Business Manager, a call so that we can coordinate our efforts. Actually, I enjoy this kind of yard work. I have been keeping things in check around my house which I find relaxing and rewarding. The list of projects is long, but I am working my way through it. This week I started trimming back the trees and other growth next to the sidewalk on Nichols Road that passes in front of the parish. It has been a few years since it received any significant attention, and the sidewalk is almost unpassable because of the overgrowth. Mother Nature can do beautiful things, but she can also put up a battle when she wants to expand her territory.

If you come to the Parish Office or attend daily Mass in the Chapel these days, you will notice it is on the warm side. One of the two compressors for the large air conditioning unit that cools the office has failed and we are awaiting a replacement. 



The Life Center is expanding our post abortion ministry to include pregnancy loss.

There is a need to educate people to the pain and suffering women and men experience as they go through the grieving process for the loss of their pregnancy.

If women and men knew the physical and emotional pain they would suffer having an abortion, perhaps they would change their hearts and choose life.

Many women and men as well, suffer and grieve the loss of their baby through a natural pregnancy loss.

Our program consists of Bible Studies, in-person and via Telecare or Zoom counseling, weekend retreats, and public speaking engagements.
